Schools must reach Gold certification (a minimum of 75% of the possible points in each of the six sections i.e,. teamwork and leadership, energy conservation, waste minimization, school ground greening, curriculum, and environmental stewardship) and claim a minimum of 20 out of 25 Platinum points to be assessed for Platinum certification.
