SVS, COURSE SELECTION & SUMMER SCHOOL

Families will have received email communication from YRDSB regarding the option of **Secondary Virtual School (SVS) for the 2022/2023 school year**. Families will have until **April 7th** to express their desire via Google Transfer Form (located in the YRDSB email) to leave Markville Secondary School to attend SVS. Course selection for students choosing SVS will be provided upon registering for SVS.

For students remaining at MSS, the 2022/23 Course Change Form will be sent out to student GAPPs emails on April 8th, allowing families a final opportunity to make changes to next year's selection. The form will close on April 11th @ 8pm. This form is only to be used if a change is necessary - if a student is happy with the selection they see in myBlueprint, no action is necessary. Students interested in discussing potential changes are encouraged to book an appointment next week with Guidance.

Summer school registration will open April 19th - Guidance will be certain to provide registration steps as we get closer to date.

POST-SECONDARY INFORMATION




Peer Tutoring

In partnership with the Canadian Society for Yad Vashem, the York Region District School Board invites classes in grades 7 to 12, parents/guardians, and greater community to attend a virtual live tour of Yad Vashem, also known as the World Holocaust Memorial Center. Yad Vashem's Holocaust History Museum tells the chronological story of the Holocaust through the personal stories of the victims using diaries, art and artifacts belonging to the victims, or created by the victims themselves. *Parents/guardians and community members are asked to be mindful that the language and content of the program is geared primarily towards grade 7 and 8 audiences.

*Educators who register will be provided with complimentary educational materials to utilize for prior and post learning with students.

Ontario's <u>Holocaust Memorial Day Act</u> recognizes Yom HaShoah v'HaGevurah as a day to commemorate the victims of the Holocaust of 1933-1945. Such a day provides an opportunity to reflect on and educate about the enduring lessons of the Holocaust.
