



#### Who are South Asians?

According to the Canadian Encyclopedia, <u>South Asian Canadians</u> trace their origins to South Asia, which encompasses India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. Most South Asian Canadians are immigrants or descendants of immigrants from these countries, but immigrants from South Asian communities established during British colonial times also include those from

East and South Africa, Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago, Fiji and Mauritius. [Some South Asian Canadians come from Britain, the US and Europe. In the 2016 census, 1,963,330 Canadians reported South Asian origins (1,603,000 single and 360,330 multiple responses)".

That said, the experiences of individual students and their families are so rich and diverse that they cannot be neatly packed into labelled boxes.
