

# **Students Entering Grade 10**

- COMPULSORY GRADE 10 COURSES: Math, English, Science, History and Civics/Careers\*
- Choose appropriate level(s) for Math/English/Science/History Subject teachers can advise
- Ensure student has earned French credit, Arts credit, Phys. Ed. credit
- Choose 3 electives 4 if choosing Music Repertoire
- Community Hours get started ASAP

# **Levels for Grade 10**

- Choose appropriate level based on grade 9 achievement (applied/academic/locally dev./gifted)
- Be realistic pathway may need to change
- Be open to strategize in order to increase and/or improve foundation in a subject area i.e. applied and academic math
- Feeling successful is important
- Strong success in one level might mean movement to another level - get guidance/special education/subject teacher advice

# **Students Entering Grade 11**

## **Graduation Requirements and Course Choices**

- Important to choose Grade 11 courses carefully
  - Prerequisites for Grade 12
  - Foundation Gr 9/10 achievement; Strategize again
- Choose Group 1, 2 or 3 courses if these credit(s) are missing
- Reach ahead to Grade 12 is okay
  - recommend only 1 or 2 courses\*
- Community Service Hours should be well underway
- Unsuccessful Literacy Test, enrol in OLC401
- 34 credit cap for students in day school after year 4

# **Levels for Grade 11**

- Applied and academic now change to C (college), M (college/university) or U (university)
- Choose carefully universities and colleges see grade 11 marks
- It can often be better to choose C or M if going to college
- 'Open' courses are a good way to balance out schedules

# **Students Entering Grade 12**

## Requirements

- Select Grade 12 courses carefully
  - ensure all Graduation Requirements are met
- Choose Prerequisites for Pathway(s) and Program(s)\*
- Grade 11 marks are in an indicator of Grade 12 success
- Grade 12 students must take a minimum of 3 courses each semester (strongly recommend choosing 8)
- Can choose 1 alternative course (optional)
- Complete community hours this summer
- Unsuccessful Literacy Test, enrol in OLC40

## **Levels for Grade 12**

If destination is College - highly recommend
 College English and College Math - for other
 courses choose C, M or U level

 If destination is University - students must have a minimum of 6 U or M level courses

#### **Reaching Ahead**

- No reaching ahead in Grade 9.
- Not generally recommended in Grade 10 however, a strong student can manage one grade 11 course if desired. (\*\*CAUTION - universities and colleges will see all Grade 11 marks so students must be ready for the challenge)
  - Consider foundation (MPM2D & SCH3U); 1yr without pre-req before Post
- Grade 11 students can choose 1 or 2 Grade 12 courses if desired.
   Important to watch their workload (Grade 12 courses count towards Post).
- Be prepared to collaborate with older students.
- Making timetable changes if they make a mistake may be impossible.

Courses/Programs with Special Application Procedures (Grades 11 and 12)

- Cooperative Education (Co-Op); Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)
- Specialist High Skills Major Program (SHSM)
- Dual Credit Courses
- Advanced Placement (Pre-AP/AP)

#### **Cooperative Education**

Students have an opportunity to have a work experience in an area of interest

Can be 2 credits, 4 credits or 1 credit

• Co-op Application must be completed with course selection via bit.ly link in the co-op course description in MyBlueprint

**Choosing Co-op Course Codes:** 

COP for Co-op; 3 for Grade 11, 4 for Grade 12; X7 = 1 credit, X# = 2 credits Example - grade 11 2 credit co-op: choose <u>COP3X#</u>

To choose 4 credit co-op: <u>COP3X# and COP4X# (regardless of grade)</u>

#### **OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program)**

- For students interested in an apprenticeable trade
- Involves a 4 credit Co-op experience combined with some college training
- Co-op hours will count toward their apprenticeship
- Interested students should see Ms. Nicholson or Ms. Shah in the Co-op department (Rm. 227)

#### Military Co-op - 4 credits

#### **SHSM - Specialist High Skills Major**

An opportunity for to Specialize in an area of interest for Grade 11 and 12. Available for all pathways.

Options: Health and Wellness, Business, Environment, ICT (Information and Communication Technology), and Arts and Culture

Includes: Subject Specific Courses, 2 Credit Co-op, Certifications, Reach Ahead Opportunities, and Experiential Learning Field Trips

Grade 10 Students can apply for next year. They must fill out an application.

- An opportunity for college bound students to take a college course on a college campus in their Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 year
- Great selection of courses available 1 class per week
- Receive both a college credit and a high school credit for one course
- Motivating for post secondary
- Application process must occur with a guidance counsellor (Ms. Scagnetti)

#### Advanced Placement

- Offer Pre-AP and AP courses
- To be considered students must be strong in the subject area, manage stress well, and have excellent work habits
- They are competitive entry. Students in Grade 10 can apply for their Grade 11 year and Grade 11 students can apply for their Grade 12 year.
- Reaching ahead in Grade 10 is generally not considered especially for English and Math
- No application is needed. Students can choose the desired course in MyBlueprint. Course departments make their selection based on the above criteria.

### **Pre AP/AP Course Offerings for 2020/21**

**Pre-AP: English, Math, Economics** 

AP: English, Calculus, Microeconomics,

European History, Human Geography, Chemistry

Advanced Placement is not a factor for admission to Canadian Universities (can be granted equivalent credit) Choose cautiously.

- AP EXAMS are written in May of each year (approx. \$125-130)

# **Students Entering Grade 11 and 12 Post Secondary Planning**

- Choose Grade 11 courses as prerequisites for Grade 12
- Students entering Grade 12 need college and university prerequisites, if attending
- Grade 11 marks are taken into consideration for early offers of admission to college and university.

### Students Entering Grade 12 Post Secondary Requirements

**For University**: All students applying need 6 U or M level Grade 12 courses (must include ENG4U and other program prerequisites)

**For College:** need Grade 12 English (college level) plus a selection of Grade 11 and 12 courses at the C, M or U level and other program prerequisites

Other Requirements may be needed: portfolio, audition, English proficiency test, interviews, supplementary applications

# **Music considerations:**

- Music Repertoire is worth a full credit for your music practice time, performances, and competitions throughout the entire school year (usually two practice times per week)
- Scheduled outside of the school day so it allows one additional course in the student's timetable
- BUT: CHOOSE REPERTOIRE LAST as the 9th course by clicking on ADD COURSE at the bottom of the list of courses
