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

## **FSL/International Languages Spotlight**

Thank you for taking the time to read about what we are doing in the French and International Languages Department at Markville. The last few years have been a challenge for students, educators and all people of our community. The FSL/International Languages Department has been working very hard to ensure that students are engaged virtually and in class with their language learning. Many



projects became virtual and students showed their great effort and initiative online.

Markville's FSL/International Languages department continues to implement the curriculum while exploring various current affairs with our students. We ensure our students are communicating about First Nations, Marginalized groups and about their mental health in our various classes.

Les Mots Qu'll Me Reste is one of the novels our students read which is about a young indigenous girl living in a residential school and her narration of her days there.

The communicative approach is still the primary focus of our department as it encourages students to speak the target language. We ensure that we are building a strong base in vocabulary without just focusing on the grammar with the respective languages. Students are encouraged to develop their language skills through speaking, listening, writing, and listening. We continue to emphasize learning about Francophone and Latin/Spanish culture. This is very important as it will aid our students to be global citizens and appreciate other cultures in a genuine way.

The traditional in-class face-to-face Night School program has used a remote learning delivery model for Semester 1 - delivered virtually in real-time **(synchronous)**. The delivery model for the Winter 2022 semester has not yet been confirmed.

# Classes are held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30-9:45 pm, and begin February 17th.

Before the start of the program, students will receive an email with instructions on how to join the class on the first day. YRDSB students will log in with their Gapps accounts.

Registration for NIGHT SCHOOL will open in <u>myBlueprint/PathwayPlanner</u> on January 4th, 2022. It is highly recommended that students register as early after it opens as possible, especially in non-STEM courses (as there are few), to ensure a space in the course, as courses fill on a first-come, first-served basis. After Thursday, February 10th, 2022, students will need to complete an online registration

form as myPathwayPlanner will be closed. Once submitted, a form will be emailed to them - it will be critical to share this form with the Guidance counsellor in order for the course to be approved.

#### ONLINE LEARNING - formerly e-Learning

https://www2.yrdsb.ca/schools-programs/online-learning-formerly-e-learning This program offers courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format (formerly referred to as "e-learning") - Classes occur online (asynchronous) using an asynchronous model, with synchronous check-in opportunities with the teacher.

Registration for E=LEARNING will open in <u>myBlueprint/PathwayPlanner</u> on **January 25th, 2022** and closes February 23rd, 2022. Just like Night School, it is highly recommended that students register as early after it opens as possible, especially in non-STEM courses, to ensure a space in the course, as courses fill on a first-come, first-served basis; e-learning is open to all of YRDSB.

**FAMILY NIGHT WEBINAR SERIES:** The next Family Webinar evening will be on **January 26th @ 6:30 p.m.**, where Markville staff will present information on Markville's **Specialty Programs**. This webinar will include information on Co-operative Education (Co-op), Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) and Advanced Placement (Pre-AP & AP) and is strategically placed prior to February's Course Selection timelines. Additionally, the following Family Night presentation will occur on **February 2nd**, to support families in **Course Selection**. Students will receive Course Selection information during school hours.




## **Peer Tutoring**

The Snow Windrow Removal Assistance Program is designed to help persons with disabilities and elderly residents maintain road access from their driveways during the winter season.
