Co-op Spotlight



From the Cooperative Education Department!

In this edition of the newsletter, the Co-op department would like to answer some FAQ's about the program:

What is Co-op?

Co-op is a unique program for Grade 11 and 12 students to experience a career choice while earning either two or four elective credits. Students can be at a Co-op placement for either half of the day (2 credits) or for the full day (4 credits). A Co-op teacher will work with students to find a placement that suits the individual's interests and abilities. The teacher is there to support the student every step of the way!

What are the benefits of this program?

Explore a career interest now to make informed choices for post-secondary destinations. In doing so, students add valuable career experience to their resume, make connections in their chosen profession/trade, and network within the industry. Many post-secondary institutions require a certain amount of hours and experience before students can apply to their programs. Students also gain resume, interview and communication skills that will give them a competitive edge now and in the future.

What is OYAP?

OYAP is the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program and is offered through the Co-op program. Students who are interested in working in a skilled trade join the Co-op program first and can then apply for OYAP. If a student qualifies for OYAP, all hours worked can count towards an apprenticeship upon graduation.

How do students sign up for the program?

Students can sign up for Co-op like any other course. **During course selection week in February, select Co-op on myPathwayPlanner.** Once students have signed up, they will be sent a package to complete and scheduled for an interview for April/May. Students are screened for aptitude, ability and suitability for the placement request.

During January and the beginning of February, the Co-op teachers gave presentations in all Grade 10 Careers and Civics classes about applying to the Co-op/OYAP program for Grade 11 or Grade 12. 
What do the students say?

FAMILY NIGHT WEBINAR SERIES

A reminder to ALL FAMILIES of the next Family Night Webinar on February 7th @ 6:30 regarding Course Selection for next year. This will be for all families of students currently in Grade 9, 10, and 11. Students will receive Course Selection information during Grade assemblies on February 12th. The LINK to the virtual presentation can be found on the Family Night Agenda.

TIMETABLE CHANGES

Students have had the last several months to make changes to Semester 2, noting that courses are incredibly tight. This coming week, Guidance will accept appointments for last minute Gr 11 or 12 pre-requisite needs, or all grade compulsory courses. Students who were unsuccessful in a compulsory course in Semester 1 should walk into Guidance with no appointment on Monday and Tuesday. If unsuccessful in Math, families are encouraged to view the resource below and book in with Guidance. Guidance will continue to work on waitlists, where possible. If change is possible, the student is contacted. Students are to follow their Semester 2 timetable, unless otherwise directed. Again, course changes are incredibly limited.

IMPORTANT: TeachAssist has opened to show Semester 2 Timetables to students. It is imperative that students are viewing TeachAssist via the TeachAssist website and **not the**

App. The App, although it shows some accurate courses and marks, is not affiliated with YRDSB – for many students, the courses and marks they are viewing are not accurate. Additionally, the App does not allow students to book Guidance Appts. Please always log into the site. If you are using the App, you are providing your confidential information to a non-approved third party. A reminder that Guardians can access TeachAsisst through the Parent Portal, using the email on file.

COURSE SELECTION

myBluePrint/myPathwayPlanner will be open to submit courses from February 15-23_{rd}. There is no benefit to being first to submit, so please choose carefully, and where needed, speak to teachers, as well as Guidance. Students attempting to make a change to their timetable this year can tell you how tight it is - it is assumed to be similar next year, therefore, it is important to think this through and do the necessary pathway research prior to selecting. Review Semester 1 Report Cards and Credit Tallys to ensure on track, and aid in this decision-making. FOR MATH-BASED decisions, please use this resource to help you understand the options. Guidance is bookable to Families via TeachAssist Parent Portal – appointments can be in person or virtual (please let us know if you need us to send a link). Instructions on how to book an appointment can be located at the bottom of the Markville Guidance website. Courses must be locked in by February 23_{rd}.

IMPORTANT: Students currently in **Grade 10 and 11** should be exploring Post-Secondary interests to review program requirements, so as to be able to choose potentially required Grade 11&12 pre-requisite courses in February for next year's **Course Selection**. It is recommended for Gr 10s to also put in courses for Gr 12, so that they can ensure the correct pre-requisites in Gr 11 (only Gr 11 courses will be locked in the system). Course selection options/information can be found here, as well as Department pathways on the Guidance website. Post-secondary information and links can be reviewed here.


POST-SECONDARY INFORMATION

The next upload to OUAC/OCAS will take place on February 10th & 11th. Students will want to confirm that their courses are in and accurate.

For Gr 12 students - as Semester 1 comes to a close, please ensure that any **Private School or alternative Board report cards** are submitted to Markville Guidance. Private schools must upload to OUAC/OCAS, but the <u>course does not count towards a student Transcript, unless MSS uploads the report card</u>. Private schools can email counsellors directly; TDSB, etc would need to be provided via the student.

Guidance will present to Gr 12 students on Accepting Your Offer on February 26th @ 3:30 virtually. We will post reminders in the Guidance Google Classroom.
