## Message from Guidance

#### **POST-SECONDARY INFORMATION**

The **OUAC** application deadline passed on January 15th <u>for equal consideration</u>, however students can continue to apply/add/change programs and be considered once all applicants prior to January 15th have been examined.

Applications to OCAS are due February 1st.

#### **COURSE SELECTION**

**Course Selection** will be open for submission on **February 13, closing on February 21, 2025**. Students can enter courses at any point now, but MUST be locked in by February 21st. There is <u>no advantage</u> to submitting early, so please make your selection carefully, as elective changes (unless pathway changes) can be incredibly challenging.

IMPORTANT: Students in Grade 10 and 11 should be exploring Post-Secondary interests to review program requirements, so as to be able to choose potentially required Grade 11&12 pre-requisite courses in February for next year's Course Selection. #### **NIGHT SCHOOL SEMESTER 2:**

YRDSB Sem 2 Night School registration is still Open. Students must register on myBlueprint, as well as complete a Google form that provides Guardian consent. No registrations will be approved without both MBP and the form being completed. Students can review YRDSB course options. The first night of class is Thursday, February 13, 2025 and the program ends Thursday, June 5, 2025. Please be advised that the traditional in-class face-to-face Night School program (Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 pm to 9:45 pm) will continue to use a remote learning delivery model. The program will be delivered virtually in real-time (synchronous).

Students can also look into Night School course options at other Boards. Their registration deadlines and process will each be different. Students wishing to register externally would need to review the process for receiving permissions and seek Guidance support.

#### **FAMILY NIGHT WEBINAR SERIES**

The next Family Webinar evening will be on **January 22th @ 6:30**, where Markville staff will present information on Markville's **Specialty Programs**. This webinar will include information on *Co-operative Education (Co-op)*, *Dual Credit*, *Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)* and Advanced Placement (Pre-AP & AP) and is strategically placed prior to February's Course Selection timelines. It is most beneficial for families of students going into Gr 11 & 12 next year. Additionally, the following Family Night presentation will occur on **February 5th**, to support families in *Course Selection*. Students will receive Course Selection information during school hours. Links will be posted in the **FN Agenda**.

#### **AQUATIC LEADERSHIP PROGRAM**

Registration for the Aquatic Leadership Program - Part 1 and Part 2 - is open, and spots are available.

Part 1 of the program is available at 1 location, which is the city of Richmond Hill. In Part 1, students work on the Healthy Living and Aquatic Activities, Grade 10 Open (PAQ2O1) course. Embedded in the course are: Lifesaving Society's Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, and Standard First Aid with CPR-C Certifications. In order to receive the PAQ2O1 credit, students must demonstrate the expectations in the Ontario Curriculum which go beyond the Lifesaving Society's certifications.

Part 2 is being offered at three locations, City of Markham, City of Vaughan, and The Town of Aurora. In Part 2 of the program students work on Recreation and Health Active Living Leadership, Grade 12 University/College Course. Embedded in the course are: Lifesaving Society's National Lifeguard Certification and the Lifesaving Society's Swim and Lifesaving Instructor Certification. In order to receive the PLF4M1 credit, students must demonstrate the expectations in the Ontario Curriculum which go beyond the Lifesaving Society's Certifications.

For more information on how to register access the following Aquatics Leadership Program <u>link</u>. Students must register for the program on the Board website before registering with the municipality. Students have until February 1, 2025, to register for Part 1, as they will be required to pass a swimming test, before classes start. The deadline to register for part 2 is February 6, 2025.

## **Tips for Winter Walking**


Walking to school in winter not only benefits student physical and mental health, well-being and academic performance, it's also fun!

Here are a few tips to help you stay safe and enjoy winter walks to school.

- 1. Dress for the weather. Wear layers. Don't forget your hat and mitts.
- 2. **Protect your feet.** Wear warm socks and winter boots. They will protect your feet from snow, rain and cold and have good grips.
- 3. **Be visible.** Wear bright clothes, stay on the sidewalks and make sure cars can see you when you cross the road.
- 4. **Allow a little more time.** Prepare your winter gear the night before and give yourself a little more time to walk to school.
- 5. **Obey road signs.** The seasons change but road safety rules remain. Stop at roads and crosswalks. Cross with a crossing guard where possible. Look out for cars.



Take some time and review winter dressing with your child.



**If you are driving, please follow road rules.** Remember that our school zones are busy with students and families. It is important that we all follow the rules to ensure student safety.

• Use the kiss and ride. Do not use dedicated bus lanes.

- Consider parking near the school and walking the rest of the way (obeying all neighbourhood parking rules).
- Obey all speed limits and road traffic signs in school zones.
- Focus on the road and watch for crossing guards and students crossing the road.
