## Message from our Trustee

February 2023

I hope everyone has had a wonderful start to 2023, and enjoyed their winter break.

One of the most important roles of school board trustees is **communicating with the public.** I hope to use this newsletter as one way to keep you updated on Board news, to communicate my role as trustee and how I can support you, and to answer some of the questions I am often asked as a trustee.

Communicating with the public includes both sharing information and attending events to build relationships with families, but also ensuring I am available to you. If you have questions about Board policies or budget, concerns about your community, ideas and suggestions, or have a question and don't know <u>who to call</u>, please feel free to reach out. I am happy to assist you.

As I settle in my new role, I look forward to visit our schools in the coming weeks and meet in person our staff and parent councils to make myself available to them for any support.

Our Board of Trustees is made up of 12 trustees elected during the municipal election process, and one Indigenous trustee appointed through a separate process. As one of the new trustees, I am looking forward to connecting with families and fulfilling my roles to support student achievement and well-being.

# What do Trustees Do?

In addition to communicating with the public, we are also responsible for:

**Establishing a Multi-Year Strategic Plan**. This <u>plan</u> sets out our priorities as a school board and guides our direction and decision making as a system.

**Setting policy**. <u>Policies</u> govern the operation of our schools and organization, including field trips, school transportation, homework, caring and safe schools and much more. You can find out which policies are up for review in our <u>meeting agendas</u>, or which <u>policies are out for comment</u> on the website. Your participation in this process is important to ensuring our policies are serving our communities and align with our priorities.

**Setting an annual budget.** I look forward to sharing more information about this process with you in the coming months as we engage in <u>budget</u> consultations.

**Participating on Board and Advisory Committees**. You can find the dates and agendas for these meetings on the Board website. You are welcome to attend and observe any <u>public Board</u>, <u>Advisory and Board Committee meetings</u>.

**Hiring the Director of Education**. This process is governed by the <u>Director of</u> <u>Education Selection Policy</u>, and we will keep you updated as this process progresses. In the meantime, I am deeply grateful to Interim Director of Education Scott Yake for his commitment and service.

Advocating for quality public education. I became a school board trustee because I believe in public education. I believe in the potential of each and every one of our students and our responsibility to nurture their learning, growth and achievement. Our decisions as a board are centred on our commitment to deliver the best for our students.

# What's Happening in YRDSB

<u>Kindergarten</u> registration opened January 20 for families with children who will start Kindergarten in September 2023.

<u>French Immersion registration</u> is open from January 20-February 6 for students entering Grade 1 in September 2023.

<u>Student trustee elections</u> are currently underway. All students in Grades 5-12 will have an opportunity to vote for the student trustees who will represent them next school year.

In February, we recognize Black History Month, celebrating the contributions of Black people to the fabric of our society. ### FP@MSS Spotlight

In December 2022, Flash Print @ MSS hosted 8 ventures who offered design services and sold their goods in the atrium over 10 lunch periods. 5 of the 8 ventures posted strong profits. These ventures sold stickers, home décor/signs, greeting cards and special paper bags. Exercising their customer service skills and persevering

through the two weeks of sales and production, student entrepreneurs raised a total of \$203.05. This profit will be donated to Sick Kids Hospital on behalf of these 5 ventures and Markville Secondary School.

To extend this entrepreneurial journey at Flash Print, and to conclude the semester, Ms. Joanna Bull, YRDSB's Experiential Learning Consultant, has been invited to visit MSS. She will inform students about an entrepreneurial grant that YRDSB is offering. Students will not only learn how to access this grant but also have an opportunity for Ms. Bull to assess some of the ideas that students may already have.

#### **COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION**

Our next Family Night Webinar, "Course Selection" has been changed in format to meet the needs of as many parents/guardians as possible. We will pre-record this presentation and post it on the Markville website so it can be viewed at your convenience. It will be posted on Friday, February 10th which is the same day on which Guidance will be conducting grade assemblies to review the Course Selection process live at school with all students. These assemblies will occur during period 1 for Grade 9 and Grade 11 students and period 2 for Grade 10 students.

All Students must complete their **Course Selections** in **My Pathway Planner** (MyBlueprint) between **Thursday, February 16th at 9 am until Friday, February 24th at 4:00 pm**. Course selection will be locked after this time. Students who are **not returning to Markville next year because they are** <u>moving to another board or are graduating must click on</u> <u>the</u> "**NOT RETURNING**" feature on **My Pathway Planner**. There is no benefit to being first to submit, so please choose carefully, and where needed, speak to teachers, as well as Guidance.

#### NIGHT SCHOOL / ONLINE LEARNING (grades 11 and 12)

Please note that students can only register for YRDSB Continuing Education courses (Night School or eLearning) if we are UNABLE to schedule the credit at Markville. Night school at YRDSB runs virtually through 2 models. The synchronous (real time) session is now open for student registration on MyBlueprint. The online learning/asynchronous night school session will open for registration on January 31 also on MyBlueprint. We have been informed that there will be very few spaces available for online/asynchronous night school. In order to obtain parent/guardian consent for night school registration students registering for night school must complete this Google Form, in addition to registering on MyBlueprint\_Registration Form for Approval Remember a full course load is a total of 4 courses in a semester. If you are signing up for night school, you may need to drop a day school course to maintain a manageable course load. Night school synchronous classes are held on **Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30-9:45 pm, and begin February 21st, 2023.** 

Before the start of the program, students will receive an email with instructions on how to join the class on the first day. YRDSB students will log in with their GAPPS accounts.
