SHSM Spotlight

The Specialist High Skills Major is a program students can join that allows them to gain credits towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma while learning about a specific sector at the same time. The benefits of the SHSM program to students include:

At Markville Secondary School, we offer the Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program in the following sectors: Arts and Culture, Business, Environment, Health and Wellness, and Information and Communications Technology. Students apply for this program in grade 10 when they are selecting their courses for their grade 11 year.

Here at Markville, we have a number of teachers who support each sector. For this newsletter, we will highlight the Health and Wellness SHSM sector. This school year, students in the Health and Wellness sector have had the opportunity to complete the following certifications: St. John Ambulance CPR and First Aid Awareness, Infection Control, WHMIS, Specialized Care, Concussion Awareness, Advanced Training in Technology, Sterile Techniques, and Food Handler Safety.

New to Markville this year was an opportunity for the Health and Wellness SHSM students to earn a certification in lab practices through the completion of a series of biotechnology labs. These labs included DNA extraction, gel electrophoresis, and the engineering of bacteria. They had a chance to grow and engineered bacteria to produce something for them, such as a colorful bio-pigment. These engineered bacteria were even used to produce artwork! We are looking forward to using our PCR machine before the end of the school year.

"I enjoyed working with a team and seeing the various results of the experiment. It was really cool to use different machines such as the cold and hot stations, and centrifuge. In addition, the many ingredients we used, such as the T.Buffer and DNA plasmids was really insightful."

"The hands-on learning approach was really engaging, and it was cool to be able to work with living organisms!"

"It was a really fun and insightful experience!"

Please note - if a student selects a course that is currently on their course selection for next year, Guidance is no longer able to replace it with another course. The student's new request will be placed on a waitlist and tended to, where possible, once the schedule has been built.

2022/23 Registration Opportunities

Day School Online Learning Registration for 2022-23 is open. This is for students going into Gr 11 or 12 who KNOW that they would like to take a course via Online Learning (asynchronous) vs MSS. Note that students can continually sign up, once they know what their timetable will be in August. IMPORTANT: If a student selects Online Learning and the course is removed from their MSS selection, please note that it may not be possible to get it back at a later date, should the student change their mind. More information about Day School Online courses can be found <u>here</u>.

In terms of the **Government-mandated Online courses**, apparently the YRDSB email to CURRENT GRADE 10 FAMILIES (only) will be coming out in June and will contain a Google Form allowing them to Opt Out of the Online requirement. Families can complete this form independently to Opt Out, or can contact Guidance to request Guidance to Opt Out on their behalf. No action is required for those not seeking to Opt Out. More information has been posted <u>here</u>. Current Gr 9 students will receive Opt Out communication in the new school year.

Dual Credit Registration for 2022-23 is now open. Dual Credit is for Gr 11 & 12 students who are planning to attend college (primary target are students currently taking ENG3C/NBE3C). The program allows students to attend college one afternoon a week, and offers a college credit, as well as a high school credit. Courses in 22/23 will be in-person - transportation to the colleges is covered and arranged by YRDSB. Interested students should

reach out to Guidance to confirm their eligibility. Please see the <u>Dual Credit Flyer</u>, <u>Slide</u> <u>Deck</u>, as well as the <u>Registration link</u>.
