If students successfully complete the Level D - University course, it can be used as one of their top six (6) marks for post-secondary entry.

# **Science Spotlight**


### Science E-Bulletin Spotlight June 2021


For semester two, Markville's Science department had the opportunity to teach our students both virtually and to engage in learning within our physical classrooms.

During the face-to-face learning, our department tried to fit in as many labs, demonstrations, and hands-on learning experiences as possible.










When learning switched to online, our students continued to explore topics in collaborative, investigative, and interactive ways. They completed virtual labs, online simulations, and received the insights of guest speakers - such as Dr. Hossam who talked with our grade 11 Physics classes.



Those who are enrolled in the SHSM program completed certifications such as the plant and animal certification done by the Environmental SHSM students.



The science program at Markville was also enhanced by the beyond-the-classroom activities offered, such as:

- The Chem13 News Contest held by the University of Waterloo. Congratulations to Rosana Gao who placed in the top 100 in Canada and the USA and won an elemental tile!
- The Avogadro Contest held by the University of Waterloo. Outstanding performances by both Juliana Cao and Max Jiang: they each scored above the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile, placed in the top 100 in Canada and the USA and won an elemental tile!
- The Ontario Association of Physics Teachers contest (sponsored by the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering, University of Toronto).
- Markville's Ecoteam competed in both the regional and provincial Envirothon competitions.

 Markville's HOSA students performed very well at this year's HOSA Fall and Spring Leadership Conferences. Based on their results at the SLC, some students qualified for HOSA's International Leadership Conference.
