Math Dept Spotlight

Markville students participated in another full year of Math Contests hosted by the University of Waterloo.

In November, 197 of our Grade 9 - 12 students wrote the Canadian Intermediate and Senior Math Contests. Our school placed 3rd and 6th in Ontario for the Intermediate and Senior contests, respectively, out of over 400 participating schools.

In February, 191 of our Grade 9 - 11 students wrote the Pascal, Cayley and Fermat math contests and in April, 124 students wrote the Fryer, Galois and Hypatia math contests. Results from the Fryer and Galois contests have been delayed.

Of note, in the Grade 11 contests, Fermat and Hypatia, Markville placed 3rd and 2nd respectively in York Region, 6th and 7th in Ontario, and 7th and 8th in Canada out of over 560 participating schools.

In April, 119 of our Grade 9 - 12 students wrote the Euclid math contest. Markville placed 3rd in York Region, 8th in Ontario and 11th in Canada out of 1147 participating schools.

Special congratulations go to our students who received Certificates of Distinction for achieving scores in the top 25% of all participants in their respective contests. Medals will also be presented to the students who achieved the highest scores in the school.




