ESL Spotlight

Multilingual Language Learners (MLLs) in our ESL classes participated in various authentic learning activities this year.

Students in ESLAO and ESLBO learned about popular places to visit in Canada and shared their findings with peers. This information was useful as they planned their winter break. Students also wrote their very own dual language postcards updating their families and friends abroad about their life in Canada and sent them in the mail before the lunar new year.





ESLCO students read the popular

novel Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes based on the real life story of a young Japanese girl and her courageous spirit as she fought against leukemia, an aftereffect of the atom bomb that had fallen on her city when she was an infant. Students took part in reading, writing, and

speaking activities. At the closing of the novel students shared their

reflections about Sadako's story and folded paper cranes in honour of Sadako's wish for peace in the world.



During a nonfiction unit about the news, ESLCO students were assigned the task of being journalists, reporting on newsworthy events at Markville Secondary School. Students were required to observe, take notes, and interview participants or witnesses of the event. Students demonstrated their formal writing skills in news articles ranging on events that occurred at Markville such as a co-ed volleyball tournament; a YRAA Track and Field event; a guest speaker, Elly Gotz, in grade 10 History class; and the end of the year carnival.

Ms. Sheriff's ESLDO/EO class and Ms. Babirad's grade 9 art class participated in a cross-curricular exchange. During the short story unit, ESL students used the writing process to create their own original short stories. After their first drafts were completed, each ESL student was paired up with an art student. The ESL students had an opportunity to use their speaking skills to summarize their narratives; discuss its characters, conflicts, and themes. In return, the art students applied their sketching techniques to create an original drawing reflecting a significant moment or idea from the story. The stories and illustrations were compiled into a class book. It was an enriching learning experience for both classes.







Portuguese Heritage Spotlight

Bill 120 was enacted in 2001 that proclaimed June the month in which we celebrate Portuguese Canadians and all that they contribute to Canada.

In the early 1500s, Gaspar Corte Real explored the northeast coast of "Terra Nova" or Newfoundland naming Conception Bay and Portugal Cove. He sailed up the coast of Labrador and named the land Labrador. which means "farmer" in Portuguese, in honour of John "the farmer" who was one of the Portuguese explorers credited with being the first explorer to land in Labrador. Newfoundland and Labrador are described in old cartography as the "Land of Corte Real". When mail



service was first established in Canada in 1693, it was a Portuguese man, Pedro da Silva, who transported and delivered mail by canoe between Montreal and Quebec City. Portuguese fishermen started fishing cod off the coast of Newfoundland and Labrador in 1504 and have continued to do so for 500 years. On Vatican Fresco Map 1556, the northern part of Labrador is described as "Bacalhaos", the Portuguese word for cod.

The vibrant Portuguese Canadian community continues to make many significant contributions to our society. The month of June and the day of June 10, in particular, have always been a great time of celebration by the Portuguese community. The celebrations honour the life of Luis de Camoes with cultural performances, history seminars, poem recitals, street parades, and many other activities.
