Markville HOSA is holding our third MTP (Meet the Professional) night next Thursday, March 25th, 2021 from 6-7pm. We are very excited to introduce our speaker, Dr. Serena Ajani (Optometrist).

Here is a message from our speaker:

Dr. Serena Ajani received her Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Toronto with an emphasis in Biology. She then went on to receive her Doctor of Optometry degree from the Southern College of Optometry where she was an academic scholarship recipient each year. During her internship rotations, Dr. Ajani received extensive training in diagnosing and treating eye diseases such as diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma, and macular degeneration. Dr. Ajani is certified by both the Board of Examiners of Optometry in Canada and the use of Therapeutic Pharmaceutical Agents (TPA). She is also accredited in the United States by the National Board of Examiners (NBEO) and the Treatment and Management of Ocular Diseases (TMOD).

Dr. Ajani is an active member of the Canadian Association of Optometrists (CAO) and the Ontario Association of Optometrists (OAO).

Since graduating in 2007, Dr. Ajani has been a part of both private and commercial practices.

Dr. Ajani has been part of a Lenscrafters group practice, private medical optometry practice and part of an ophthalmology practice. In December 2013, she opened up Cornell Optometry, in Markham, a full scope Optometric clinic with the aim of providing comprehensive eye care.

Face to Face Rotation 4 schedule

Rotation 4 will start on Thursday March 25th for cohort A, so students will have period two as their face-to-face class on their cohort day. Wednesday March 24 students will have another Feedback day from home virtually with a modified schedule which will be posted on Markville's website.

- If a student attends school on the wrong cohort day, they will be sent home. Cohorts are created to keep everyone as safe as possible, so this is necessary.
- Afternoon online classes will consist of 40 minutes of synchronous learning with the remaining 10 minutes for independent work and/or time for students to stretch, get a drink, etc.

• Lastly, if a class or entire school needed to be closed due to COVID-19, the expectation is that all students are to connect in their virtual/online learning platforms (Google Classroom, Moodle, etc.) within 24 hours. The student would follow the same schedule in place at the time of the closure.

 - All people with Down syndrome should have full participation in decision making about matters relating to or affecting their lives;
 - Students with Down syndrome are valuable members of the classroom both with their insight and ability to teach others that diversity should be celebrated.





- Down syndrome occurs naturally about 1 in every 800 births, evenly among boys and girls, across all races and socio-economical classes;
 - Down syndrome is the most common chromosomal condition. The exact cause is still unknown;
 - Down syndrome was named after the English doctor, John Langdon Down, who was the first to categorize the common features of people with this condition.
