## Parent-Teacher Interviews (ADAPTIVE MODEL)

Parent-Teacher Interviews will be held on Wednesday, March 24, 2021 from 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. for students attending Markville's ADAPTIVE model. You will have an opportunity to meet with your child(ren)'s teacher(s) and learn more about the classroom. We regret that for health and safety reasons, we are unable to host an event at the school as we normally would; however, we look forward to meeting with you virtually.

Families can use Edsby, an online platform, to schedule a meeting time with their child(ren)'s teacher(s) on Parents' Night. You will receive an invitation to sign up for a meeting time once the schedules are available.

Edsby is a cloud-based platform that lets families easily reserve times to meet with your child(ren)'s teachers. YRDSB in partnership with Edsby have created a secure platform that protects the privacy of information for families.

Families that already have an Edsby account may use their previously created account. The username is the full email address that is on file at your child(ren)'s home school and the password is the one created at activation. If you have forgotten your password, you can find resources on the Board website to help, including how to reset your password.

Families who do not have an Edsby account will need to create one to access the online appointment scheduler for their child's teachers for Parents' Night. An up-todate and valid email address must be provided to your child's home school. For help creating an Edsby account, instructions can be found on the Board website. An email from York Region District School Board with instructions on how to create an Edsby account was sent on March 5. If you do not receive the email, please check your junk mail folder to ensure you do not miss this opportunity.

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## Feedback Day - March 11 (modified schedule)

Thursday, March 11<sup>th</sup> is our second Feedback Day of semester 2. Students and parents are reminded of the modified schedule on these days. All students will have online classes with their teachers between 8:20-10:55 am. The <u>afternoon</u> portion of Feedback Day (12:20-2:50 pm) is dedicated to complement effective routine teacher practices and may include focused individual or small group feedback sessions related to specific criteria and targeted to individual student needs.

Teachers may request to meet with students in the afternoon to support completion of missing work, provide extra-help, and/or provide descriptive feedback. Students can also request to meet with their teachers. Students achieving at Level 1 or below may be referred to the Student Success team for additional teacher support in the afternoon. Student Success will contact students and parents/guardians to confirm meeting times, as needed.

#### Face to Face Rotation 3 schedule

Rotation 3 will start on Friday, March 12 for cohort A, so students will have period two as their face-to-face class on their cohort day. Monday through Wednesday we will still be on rotation 2. On Thursday students will have another Feedback day from home virtually with a modified schedule which will be posted on Markville's website.

- If a student attends school on the wrong cohort day, they will be sent home. Cohorts are created to keep everyone as safe as possible, so this is necessary.
- Afternoon online classes will consist of 40 minutes of synchronous learning with the remaining 10 minutes for independent work and/or time for students to stretch, get a drink,

etc.

• Lastly, if a class or entire school needed to be closed due to COVID-19, the expectation is that all students are to connect in their virtual/online learning platforms (Google Classroom, Moodle, etc.) within 24 hours. The student would follow the same schedule in place at the time of the closure.



### What is the Nur Muslim Mentorship Program?

Nur is a Mentorship Program to support Muslim students in the YRDSB to feel valued, heard and empowered. Our goal is to provide a safe, supportive space that helps build a sense of belonging for Muslim students. **NOTE:** This is not a tutoring program.

### When will the program begin?

Nur will launch in the spring of 2021 and will carry through the entire 2021-2022 school year. Mentors and Mentees will be contacted at the end of April.

### Who is eligible to participate in the program?

- YRDSB staff and students who identify as Muslim
- Current Grade 8 students (who will be in grade 9 for the 2021-2022 school year)
- Current Grade 9 & 10 students

### How does the application process work?

- Staff may identify and recommend eligible students to this program and fill out the Mentee application with the student, if the student is interested in participating in the program.
- Eligible students can submit an expression of interest in the program by completing the form below
- All applicants will go through a selection process based on their own application submission.
- Once this process has been completed, all applicants will be notified of their status
