School Council Meeting

A question from our last School Council Meeting – School Ventilation Actions/Improvements

- Student safety remains one of our top priorities and this includes the actions we take related to school ventilation.

- As a Board, assessing and updating all HVAC systems in our schools is an ongoing part of the Board's multi-year renewal plan based on age and condition of the system.

- The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE), the Ontario Building Code (OBC) and Ministry of Education Guidelines are used to address the ventilation in each of our schools. This includes performing visual inspections of our HVAC systems in all schools by our Operations staff twice daily along with actively monitoring the systems through our Building Automation Systems (BAS).

-The vast majority of our schools have mechanical ventilation systems in place, so the Board has implemented filter upgrades, utilizing MERV13 filters.

-Changes to the Building Automation System (BAS) program have also been implemented, in order to flush the air in the school buildings in the morning and to maximize the intake of fresh air.

-All air handling units, return air units, and main exhaust fans are automatically scheduled to increase run times to ensure this takes place.

-There are a small number of schools that are exhaust only schools. For these schools, HEPA air purifiers have been installed in classrooms which currently do not have mechanical ventilation systems.

-Schools will also follow the standard practice of opening windows to provide an additional source of fresh air intake into the classroom.

Parent-Teacher Interviews - New date

Parents-Teacher Interviews will be held on Thursday, March 31, 2022 from 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.. You will have an opportunity to meet with your child(ren)'s teacher(s) and learn more about the classroom. For health and safety reasons, we are unable to host an event at the school as we normally would, however, we look forward to meeting with you virtually.

Families can use Edsby, an online platform, to schedule a meeting time with their child(ren)'s teacher(s) on Parents' Night. You will receive an invitation to sign up for a meeting time once the schedules are available.

<u>Edsby</u> is a cloud-based platform that lets families easily reserve times to meet with their child(ren)'s teachers. YRDSB in partnership with Edsby have created a secure platform that protects the privacy of information for families.

Families that already have an Edsby account may use their previously created account. The username is the full email address that is on file at your child(ren)'s home school and the password is the one created at activation. If you have forgotten your password, you can find resources on the Board website to help, including how to reset your password.

Families who **do not have** an Edsby account will need to create one to access the online appointment scheduler for their child's teachers for Parents' Night. An up-todate and valid email address must be provided to your child's home school. For help creating an Edsby account, instructions can be found on the Board website. An email from York Region District School Board with instructions on how to create an Edsby account was sent on March 8. If you do not receive the email, please check your junk mail folder to ensure you do not miss this opportunity.
