Learning Model Changes

In September, we shared that we would provide families further information to support switching between in person and remote learning models prior to mid-semester. Students learning remotely may request to return to face-to-face learning by contacting the school. Changes will be facilitated within 1-2 days. Transportation for Community Classes may require additional time to initiate.

Requests may also be made to move from in-person learning to remote learning. Please contact the school to request a switch to remote learning. Staff from the school will make arrangements to contact you to review the request and share information about the hybrid learning model.

• Learning model changes for students affected by COVID-19 will be facilitated within 2-3 school days.

• Model change requests will be facilitated as soon as possible and prior to midsemester reporting.

After mid-semester reporting, students and families may request a short-term COVID-19 related model change or a long-term model change for other circumstances by contacting the school. Markville's EcoClub (Environment Club) has had a successful start of the year. After the club fair, fifty new members joined the EcoClub. So far the EcoClub has organized two successfully attended events. Take Me Outside Day was on October 20th this year. It is a day when staff and students are encouraged to go outside to spend time in nature and connect with nature. The EcoClub organized a school walk during the day and set up a nature scavenger hunt during lunch. Upon completion of the scavenger hunt, students were given an opportunity to spin for an environment themed prize.





The EcoClub also organized a gardening event after school on October 22nd. Many students volunteered their time and efforts to help beautify the school's gardens after almost two years of neglect due to lockdowns and restrictions during the pandemic. The EcoClub will continue to work with staff and students this year at the school to maintain the school's platinum status, a level of certification awarded to schools by EcoSchools Canada.

Welcome to Week 4 of the four-week K-12 Cyber Awareness Month (CAM) campaign, running from October 4 to 29, 2021.

This year's campaign theme, "Cyber awareness as self-care", has the objective of helping everyone in K-12 education – teachers, staff, students and parents – be safer and more secure online. The campaign provides resources to help everyone

This past year, kids have faced unique challenges, as many of their in-person activities have been replaced with an increased use of technology. This has resulted in an unprecedented increased online presence and digital footprint for most of us, adults, and kids alike.

Everyone should assume that what is shared online will remain online forever. Every action you take online, and information posted about you contributes to your "digital footprint" which can straddle our personal, student and professional lives. Improving our awareness of the traces of data we leave online and recognizing how our individual digital footprints vary can help to improve the protection of our data online.

Topics and tips for Week 4 include:

Access the embedded links to find out more (links will take you to different websites):

- Understand what you post shapes your <u>online reputation</u> and becomes part of your <u>digital footprint</u>. Always strive to <u>establish a positive presence online</u>.
- Minimize the risk of being a target of online harassment. <u>Avoid sharing too</u> <u>much information online</u> and <u>be safe on social media</u>.
- Know that posts are <u>not always private</u>.
- Delete accounts (and associated information) that you no longer need old accounts and data can be a risk.
- Navigate safely. Take the <u>quick self-assessment on Internet Safety</u>.
