## **Schedule Change**

### Literacy At Markville

This week, our students in grade 10, period 4 classes participated in a Literacy task that focused mainly on teaching students the key terms and question types that they may encounter on the OSSLT

(Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) The lesson also helped students learn various techniques for answering multiple choice questions and strategies for reading graphic texts. The focus of these tasks is to prepare students for the OSSLT and offer helpful strategies that they can apply to their everyday learning in all of their classes.

Any student scheduled to write the OSSLT in the spring and is not in a grade 10 class during this period has been instructed to access the lesson and activities in the

"Markville Google Classroom".

The OSSLT is a standardized test that is a graduation requirement. In March 2020, due to school closures, the OSSLT did not run. Students who were meant to write in March 2020 (and are not graduating in 2020-2021) are scheduled to write the test this spring along with the current first time eligible students. In a recent memo, the Ministry of Education indicated that the literacy graduation requirement will be waived for all students graduating during the 2020-21 school year. We are monitoring updates from the Ministry of Education on the status of this year's test and will communicate any updates with you as we get them.



## **Science Department Spotlight**



With the start of another school year, Markville's Science department has been excited to have the opportunity to teach our students virtually and to engage in learning within our physical classrooms. During face-to-face learning, our department has tried to squeeze in many labs, demonstrations, and hands-on learning experiences. Sometimes it is hard to tell who is more excited, our students or our teachers!

As usual, our students are focusing on curriculum expectations and learning skills. However, the science program at Markville SS has always been enhanced by extracurricular opportunities and beyond-the-classroom activities. Despite the current environment, we strive to continue with this extra engagement. Students in our grade 11 Chemistry course will be virtually connecting with the City of Markham to learn more about water (H<sub>2</sub>O). The program provides a general overview of Markham's waterworks system, as well as background on the community's role in efficiently using and protecting water resources. Some of the grade 9 classes will be participating in the Let's Talk Science Living Space collaborative inquiry in which our students will be introduced to computational thinking and coding with micro:bits. Additional experiential learning in the grade 9 classroom will occur when students examine data collected by astronauts aboard the International Space Station.

Teachers and students have started to organize extended-learning opportunities through HOSA, and Eco-Club. The Eco-Club is highly motivated to help Markville SS achieve an EcoSchools certification of platinum again this school year. As part of the certification process, students will be increasing their environmental literacy by attending virtual environment workshops held by community partners and preparing for the annual Envirothon, a competition about the environment. As the year progresses, we will continue to provide our students with updated information with regards to the

UBC's Michael Smith Challenge, the University of Toronto's National Biology Competition, the University of Waterloo's Chem 13 News Contest and Avogadro Chemistry Contest, as well as the OAPT and SIN contests. In addition, we continue to support the SHSM sectors of Environment and Health and Wellness.
