# **Message from Guidance**

# <u>VERY IMPORTANT FOR GRADE 12 STUDENTS APPLYING TO COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY</u>

Midterm Grades are being sent to both the Ontario Colleges Application Centre (ontariocolleges.ca) and the Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC) on Friday, November 18th. The YRDSB transferred to a new timetable and mark data platform this year.

Therefore, it is extremely important that all students check their OCAS and/or OUAC accounts and look for the following:

- 1. You have applied using your legal name
- 2. Your account indicates that you will receive your OSSD by June 2023
- 3. All courses that you have taken are on your account
  - all courses since grade 9 for college admission
  - all grade 11 and grade 12 courses that are designated as "M" or "U" courses for university admission
- 4. All grades that are posted for each course are correct
- 5. Your semester 2 courses that are currently on your Markville timetable are showing as projected courses
- 6. Semester 1 current midterm grades appear and are correct
- 7. No dropped course(s) from this semester is appearing on your account
- 8. You have ensured that courses that you are taking outside of Markville i.e. private school or other school board are included

If anything does not appear correct, please come to guidance immediately and a counsellor will help you.

# **School Notices**

This letter below about the OSSLT was sent to families on November 8, 2022

Dear Families,

As per the Ministry of Education, students are required to work towards the literacy graduation requirement through participating in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) or the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OSSLC). The York Region District School Board has decided that previously eligible Grade 11 and 12 students, and all grade 10 students will write the OSSLT between November-December 2022. Students who are unsuccessful on the test this Fall will have another opportunity to write in the Spring.

All grade 10 students will write the test in their period one homeroom class, over 2 days, between **Monday, November 28, 2022 - Thursday, December 1, 2022.** The previously eligible grade 11 and 12 students will write the test (both sections) in one continuous sitting on **Friday, December 2, 2022**. The test will begin promptly at 8:25 am. (Please note that students who are <u>not</u> writing the literacy test will attend their regular classes on these days). The OSSLT is a graduation requirement for all

students working towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Students receiving special education support will be provided with the necessary accommodations, as per their IEP, for the test. Please be aware that ALL students are entitled to extra time.

There will be preparation activities taking place to support student success. Students will engage in practice activities leading up to the test and complete a practice test that is also accessible from home by accessing EQAO's website at <a href="eqao.com">eqao.com</a>.

Additionally, in the coming weeks, individual letters will be sent to each family whose child is writing the OSSLT with necessary accommodations based on a student's IEP. We wish all of our participating students much success on the Fall administration of the Ontario Secondary Literacy Test.

### WHAT WE DO

1. Watch weather forecast - 24/7

**3.** Anti-ice - Salt brine sprayed on primary roads and bridges (weather dependent)

**5.** Plow & salt the roads - Review table below for snow clearing times

7. Continue to clear snow - Can take up to 16 hours after the snow stops falling to clear all of Markham's streets

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2. Patrol and monitor the streets -24/7

 Salt trucks dispatched first to primary and secondary roads **6.** Clear the sidewalks
- City crews start when sidewalks are 5cm of snow deep

8. Respond to service requests – Wait at least 16 hours after the snow stops falling to call the Markham Contact Centre 905.477.5530

# DRIVEWAY OPENINGS: "WINDROWS"



A windrow is the row of snow at the end of a driveway after snow clearing on your street.

Sidewalk

Only residents under the Snow Windrow Removal Assistance Program will have one car width of windrow removed within 8 hours after local plow. The Snow Windrow Removal Assistance Program is designed to help persons with disabilities and elderly residents maintain road access from their driveways during the winter season.

- Markham has a Salt Management Plan that regulates our salt usage, storage and salt transportation.
- · Snow is plowed to the right and if you live on an inside corner, you will receive larger amounts of snow. Do not push snow back on the road. It is unsafe and illegal.

Parking on both sides of all City streets is prohibited during snow clearing operations.

Existing parking permits and overnight exemptions held by residents are not valid during snow clearing operations.
