A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

I am so excited to be able to welcome everyone back, staff, students and families! It has been too long since we heard our students' voices and saw them in the classrooms and the hallways. Yesterday and today, we welcomed our new Grade 9's, some excited, some shy and others testing the waters, unsure of what secondary school is all about. In the afternoon, our teachers, remotely, welcomed all our Grade 10-12 students, while the rest of us will eagerly wait until next Monday and Tuesday to see them back in the building.

We are starting a year like no other. None of us has experienced this before. I know we will have to go through hurdles and successes, that we will make some enhancements and some changes, but I also know that we are in this together, and the safety of our students remains our primary priority.

Markville staff is here to support our students and you, their families, in the best way we can. For those of you who are new to our community and for all others who are returning, please know that the success of our students depends on our joint partnership. 
