Dear families.

I thought I would share with you some common questions we receive regarding the 2021-2022 school year. Please see below:

How do we create an Edsby account?

Information about how to set up an Edsby account will be sent out closer to the Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interview Night. Please look for more information in this weekly families' E-Bulletin.

When is the Parent/Guardian Teacher Interview Night?

For semester one, the date is Wednesday, October 20, 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. At this time the meeting will be scheduled virtually.

How do we communicate with teachers other than the parent/guardian-teacher interview?

Teacher communication can be done via email or by scheduling a telephone conference. In-person meetings are possible by appointment only.

Is there a breakfast program available at Markville?

Markville offers a light, individually wrapped, breakfast program three days a week.

If a student gets sick, can the student switch to remote learning?

Students may be considered for remote learning for extenuating circumstances, where there is an extended absence such as the need to self-isolate. Arrangements need to be made with the assigned Vice-Principal (A to Lim, Barbara Caravella; Lin to Z, Kathy McAlpine)

Why are parents asked to pick up their children away from Markville's parking lot?

Our parking lot is a very busy place after school, with a lot of cars and people making their way through the lot, which poses a safety concern. In addition, students often stay longer than necessary, socializing outside in large crowds, waiting for their ride. Due to the pandemic, we are requesting that students leave the school grounds as soon as their classes end, to reduce exposure to others. Picking your children up away from the parking lot will assist us in keeping everyone safe.

Visual Arts Department Spotlight




The Markville Visual Arts Department welcomes back all Arts students into the classrooms, and those who are learning virtually.

Student Self-Assessment Process:

Students and their families received a communication with the information below, including the necessary links:

- Step 1: Students complete on-line self-assessment:
 COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool
- Step 2: Upon completion of self-assessment, students respond to the question "Have you completed the self-screening test?" in the confirmation Form
 - Students receive an email response when they respond "Yes", which will include a colour for each specific day of the week:

<mark>Monday</mark>, <mark>Tuesday</mark>, Wednesday, Thursday, <mark>Friday</mark>

- Step 3: Period 1 teacher checks with students **prior to students entering** the classroom
 - Students who indicate they did not complete the self-assessment need to be directed to the tool posted in the classroom to review and provide verbal response

This workshop will provide an opportunity for parents to better understand their adolescent, and their role as parents. During our time together we will explore questions such as: How do I see myself as a parent? Why do I choose to parent the way I do? We will also look at what our triggers are ,and our reactions to these triggers.

Conscious parenting includes awareness of ourselves as individuals, as parents, and of our teenage child. We will look at the developmental period of adolescence and the specific factors that distinguish it from other developmental periods. The aim of this workshop is to introduce you to the concepts of conscious parenting. 
