Message from Our Trustee, September 2021

The pandemic and last year's school closures affected students and families in many different ways. This has been a challenging time. Our caring, skilled and dedicated staff members are prepared to prioritize the mental health and well-being of students as they transition back to school, as well as supporting their academic learning and growth. Whether your child will be attending school in person or online, we know how important it is that they feel safe, respected and valued. We want every student to feel supported, to take pride in their identities and to know that they matter. Any form of hate or discrimination in our schools is not acceptable. This school year, we will continue to implement the Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy launched in March to address anti-Black racism in schools. We also remain committed as a school board to honouring the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action. As an education system, it is imperative that we create learning environments that enable all of our students to feel valued and to be successful.

As your school board trustee, it is my role to advocate for quality public education in York Region, and to ensure that our students remain at the centre of all of our decision making. The Board of Trustees makes policy and budget decisions, and

communicates with the public, among other <u>responsibilities</u>. We are also responsible for setting direction for the school board, through our <u>Multi-Year Strategic Plan</u>. This plan sets out four priorities: Foster Well-Being and Mental Health, Build Collaborative Relationships, Champion Equity and Inclusivity, and Empower Ethical Leadership.

Parking Lot

Our parking lot went through a major transformation over the summer of 2019. Consultants listened to the safety concerns of parents / guardians, students, staff, and community members and came up with a redesign to address these issues. The parking section is now self-contained, so anyone coming to park at the school will not have to cross traffic to get safely to the school doors. The new drop off circle is meant for short term pick-ups and drop offs only. To reduce congestion, we always recommend that students walk or bike to school – even when it's raining! If this is not possible, consider a pick up point away from the school such as the Centennial Community Centre. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we all adjust to the traffic flow.

Daily School Screening for Students

Secondary students will follow the process below to confirm screening:

Step 1: Secondary students to complete on-line self-assessment COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool prior to entering the school on a daily basis.

Step 2: Upon completion of the self-assessment, complete response to the question "Have you completed the self-screening test?" in the Confirmation Form

Step 3. Upon completion of the form confirming successful screening, students will receive an email.

Step 4: After receiving this email, students can then attend their school and will have to show the email response in one of the following ways to their period 1 teacher (or period 2 teacher if they have a spare or were absent in period 1):

- Show email on phone (showing the email or a photo of the email)
- Hard copy printout of the email
- Students who do not complete the self-assessment will be directed to the posted COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening tool to provide verbal response to their teacher
- If "no" to all questions on the tool, the students will be able to start their day in the classroom, or
- if "yes" to any question, the students will be directed to the designated isolation room for pickup and will be advised to attend an assessment centre.

For students who may not be able to complete the self-assessment process independently, Parents/guardians are to complete:

- Step 1: The on-line self-assessment <u>COVID-19 School and Child-Care</u> <u>Screening Tool</u> prior to sending students to school on a daily basis.
- Step 2: Parents/guardians will need to log into the Confirmation Form through their child's YRDSB gapps account, to indicate they have completed the assessment on behalf of their child.

Please note some important details from Guidance:

New students that have begun attending classes, yet still require access to YRDSB's online platforms, can access instructions on how to log into GAPPs, myBlueprint and TeachAssist here. Your student's subject teacher can provide them with their confidential and unique password, or please reach out to Guidance.

Students received a Course Change Request form for **Semester 1** changes on August 30th – <u>Gr 9 Course Change Request</u> & <u>Gr 10/11/12 Course Change Request</u>. Although primarily Semester 1 changes are occurring at this time, for planning purposes, students also received their Semester 2 Timetable via GAPPs and Guardian email. This form will **remain open until September 10**th @ **3pm.** Course space is limited, but Guidance will do all that is possible to provide students with desired/required courses, in a priority sequence. Guidance will open for appointments to students and families to address Semester 2 changes as soon as Semester 1 has been finalized.




