


Land Acknowledgement







Signs/symptoms that families are seeing

Withdrawn, depression, disengaged, low mood, loss of appetite, anxiety, low affect, eating disorders

Isolation factor

Lingering effects of being online academically and socially

The reintegration back to 'new normal'

Surprising decline (getting worse, not better)/expression of covid impacts (coming to surface); lack of social skills/ new social cues, managing conflicts



Online learning graduation requirement

- Recently officially announced by Ministry of Education (Memorandum 167)
- YRDSB designing implementation in accordance with policy - no information currently available
- Current grade 10 and below requirement grade 10 will be allocated 1 as completed
- Will have opt-out option with limited requirements



Updates Starting March 21st

Masks - not required, optional on a daily basis

Masks <u>required</u> when:

- close contact of a COVID-19 case or symptomatic individual for 10 days in school; avoiding high contact sports and playing wind instruments
- returning from international travel for 14 days after arrival back in Canada

Updates continued

Daily Screening

- Review and adhere to the screening tool prior to entering the school
- Staff, students and visitors not passing the screening <u>must not enter</u> the school and follow screening tool guidelines
- No need for confirmation of completion of screening tool

Updates continued

- Students may sit in groups to facilitate conversation and collaboration in the classroom
- Hand hygiene and cleaning protocols will continue
- Field trips not yet allowed
- Vaccination attestation not required to participate in school athletics
- Consultation with York Region Public Health will be ongoing
