Land Acknowledgement Hearing all Voices

YRDSB recognizes the importance of reconciling with Indigenous people.

Many of our meetings and events begin with a Land Acknowledgement that is relevant to our location based on the two treaties that cross our region: Treaty 13 - Toronto Treaty Mississauga of the Credit (to the west towards Peel Region) and Williams Treaty Chippewas of Georgina Island, Rama and Beausoleil (to the east towards Durham Region). The reasons are:

- The treaties are still significant and relevant today
- It helps connect people with the very rich history of this region and makes it clear that there were a variety of groups who lived here prior to Confederation, who managed these lands according to their own customs and ways

As a result, there are many educational opportunities for students, families and staff to become aware of where they live and the real and significant history of this land and their relationship with it through the ongoing relationship with Indigenous people. (YRDSB Board website)

Land Acknowledgement

We affirm that we are all treaty people and acknowledge that the York Region District School Board is located on the lands of two treaties. These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.

To honour this agreement we will take up our responsibility to be respectful of their traditions, knowledge and inherent rights as sovereign nations. We will respect their relationship with these lands and recognize that our connection to this land is through the continued relationship with these First Nations, and we acknowledge our shared responsibility to respect and care for the land and
waters for future generations.




Terry Fox Event: Sept. 23-Sept. 29





PURPOSE AND ROLE OF THE SCHOOL COUNCIL

School councils are advisory bodies that can make recommendations to the principal or the Board on matters as stated in Board Policy and procedure. Specifically, school councils are responsible for:

- **promoting** parent, family and community **engagement** in support of student achievement and wellbeing in an equitable and inclusive manner
- participating in the development and implementation of the school improvement plan
- communicating with, and providing ongoing advice to the principal on school-related matters
 - collaborating with the principal to coordinate community resources that support student learning, achievement and well-being
- understanding and communicating with members of the community about the roles and responsibilities of school councils as outlined in the School Councils policy and procedure and appropriate guidelines and legislation, as required

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- Council members elect the executive positions
 - Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, Secretary
- Positions can only be held by parent members and not employed by the Board
- All parent members are eligible, regardless of prior experience
- Positions can be filled by election or appointment
- The term of office is one year; members may be re-elected or re-appointed


