
Remembrance Day

Cancellation of Bus Service Because of Weather



- · field trips will also be cancelled
- · any special day (Pajama Day) will be cancelled
- · any planned lunches (pizza day) will be cancelled
- · it is the responsibility of parents to ensure the safe arrival and pick up of their children
- · no a.m. bussing means no p.m. bussing
- · depending on availability of staff, several classes may be combined and students will be offered a highly modified program
- · students may not be with their own teachers or grade level

If your child is not coming to school due to bad weather, please call the school for safe arrival, all students have to be accounted for each day. It should also be noted that on heavy snow days, the buses are likely to be 10-15 minutes later than usual. If your child is waiting longer than 20 minutes in the morning, please call directly to your child's bus company or check our school website and select the bussing icon to schoolbuscity.com.



Extreme Weather Conditions

All students are expected to go out for every recess unless the principal or vice-principal decides, based on YRDSB guidelines, that weather conditions are such that it would be detrimental for students to be outdoors. Students are to come to school dressed for outdoor play and prepared to be outdoors up to 40 minutes after lunch. Weather conditions, including temperature, wind chill, sun/cloud cover and wind velocity, are continuously monitored and in extreme weather conditions, recess breaks may be shortened or students kept indoors. During the cold months of winter, students should be dressed appropriately for the daily weather conditions:

☐ Bring a change of clothes, including socks, in case a change is needed due to wet and cold

weather
☐ Dress in layers of loose-fitting clothing
☐ Cover and protect exposed skin from the harsh elements
☐ Boots, hats, scarves, snow pants and mitts or gloves will help make recess an enjoyable time
☐ During the hot sunny weather, students should protect themselves by:
☐ Seeking shade or creating their own
☐ Wearing a hat and suitable clothing to cover their skin
☐ Putting on sunglasses (that provide UV protection) to protect their eyes
☐ Applying sunscreen 20 minutes before exposure to the sun.

Parents sometimes request their children be kept indoors during recess times because they are not feeling well. Students with illnesses serious enough to prevent them from participating in physical education, recesses or other outdoor activities should remain at home until their condition improves. This will also benefit the students concerned and prevent the spread of this illness to others.

If road conditions force the cancellation of bus services, the following stations will be informed as early as possible, and will broadcast pertinent information to the community.

We have instructed all of our students that for SAFETY REASONS SNOWBALLING IS FORBIDDEN. There may be times where a teacher may supervise a snow activity such as snow/ice sculpture building if conditions are appropriate; however, with the exception of these activities, and the making of snowmen or snow forts, SNOW MUST STAY OUT OF HANDS AND ON THE GROUND at all times.

Students are aware of the following consequences:

1st incident: detention/no snowballing assignment

2nd incident: warning letter goes home

3rd incident: Possible Suspension

Injury to a student could result in suspension even for a first incident. We appreciate your support in all matters relating to your child(ren)'s safety. Please take time with your child to review this policy.

Keeping Our Schools Safe & Orderly

(We have been instructed to share the following message with our community.) In accordance with the principal's responsibilities under the Education Act to ensure a safe and orderly learning environment, the school has the right to search school property, such as lockers and desks, without notice to or permission of any person. From time to time, the police may be invited onto school property to conduct their own searches and these searches may be conducted without notice or permission of any member of the school community as per our Joint Board and Police Protocol. When conducting a search of school property, persons or personal property, the police are responsible for conforming to all legal requirements with respect to searches.



Top 5 Things to Know about Pick Ups and Drop Offs

- 1) Entry through South Driveway only. No exceptions. Please obey posted signs.
- 2) Exit through North Driveway only. No exceptions. Please obey posted signs.
- 3) Drive slowly for the safety of all of the children
- 4) A.M. drop-off is a Kiss 'n Ride only. There is no parking in the bus loop. Park only in designated spots.
- 5) Follow the direction of the staff on duty. They are there to keep all of the children safe and congestion to a minimum.

Prevent Infection by Hand Washing!

It is that time of year when many children get ill with vague symptoms such as fever, sore throat, vomiting and diarrhea. If your child becomes ill with these symptoms please keep them home from school until they have recovered. If the symptoms persist please consult your family physician. Please remember that hand washing is the single most important procedure for preventing infections.

Recommendations on Hand Washing:

Hands must be washed using soap and warm water:

- · before preparing, handling, serving or eating food
- · when hands are visibly dirty
- · after personal body functions, such as using the toilet or blowing one's nose
- · for parents, after changing diapers or cleaning up vomit

If your child is going to be away from school for any reason, please make sure that you report their absence. Please give the office a call at 905-895-3081 and leave a message between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. You can also use Edsby to report an absence. On a busy day with many absences, confirming the whereabouts of every absent child can take quite awhile and could result in a child missing for some time. LATES: GIVE US 5 MINUTES MORE

Last month we had a number of late students here at Meadowbrook, large numbers students stood in the front hall every morning waiting to sign the book. If this month each of these students would leave 5 to 10 minutes earlier in the morning, this would reduce our late students by nearly 90 % each morning. Therefore, I am asking that parents help us make sure our students arrive at school well before 8:25 a.m. in the morning. The first bell brings the students into the school in a timely fashion so they can properly prepare themselves for the day. This avoids late students who can be disruptive to other classes, their class and themselves. The school day official starts at 8:30 a.m. with students sitting in their desks, listening to the morning announcements and the Canada National Anthem. Morning announcement contain information about teams, practices, clubs and other important information for keeping your child safe and happy in our school. So, we are looking for your help in getting your children out the door 5 to 10 min. earlier and making sure we set them up for a successful day. Please give us 5 minutes more and have your children to school every morning before 8:15 a.m.



Parent Teacher Interviews

Student/Parent/Teacher interviews will be happening on the evening of Thursday, November 14th and morning of Friday, November 15th.

Student/Parent/Teacher interviews will be booked through EDSBY which will allow families to attend these important interviews. In order to access this, you need to accept the initiation that was sent out through EDSBY to set up your EDSBY account, if you haven't already.

We will open up access to booking your interview times starting Monday, November 11th at 8am. The tool will remain open until **Thursday, November 14th at 9am.** If you have set up your EDSBY account, you will receive an email from EDSBY letting you know when the booking is open.

You can also login to your EDSBY account starting Monday, November 11th at 8am where you will see you have a notification in your mailbox.
