## Kiss and Ride – Parking Lot information

Each day at Meadowbrook PS, students are bussed, walk, ride bikes, and are droppedoff and picked-up in cars by caring adults. Transitional times during morning arrival and afternoon dismissal coincide with the busiest times in our parking when traffic is at its highest volume. For those who live within walking distance, we encourage walking students to school or parking a short distance away and walking in to avoid unsafe congestion. Construction in our area is causing more need for safety this year. Please remind students who are walking to cross the street at the Crossing Guard and to stay on the sidewalk.

## Morning Procedure:

To ensure the safety of all students and to improve the flow of traffic in the morning, families are asked to drop students off at the sidewalk as you enter the parking lot and to exit through the back lane of our parking lot. Cars are not permitted in the bus loop during drop off or pick up times to ensure the safety of students. Parents and caregivers who wish to enter the school with a child must park their car in the parking lot or safely on a side street to avoid impeding fire and bus routes. No vehicles should be parked along the curb of the bus loop.

## Afternoon Procedure:

In the afternoon, our bus loop will be closed at 2:30 to ensure student safety at dismissal. Please do not enter the bus loop until after the busses leave. We ask that no cars park along the bus route. Our parking lot has limited capacity and becomes very busy at pick up. We highly recommend walking to meet students rather than driving.

## Wadoka Martial Arts:

With the huge response, we find ourselves in need of the martial arts uniforms. If you have children attending who already have a guy, please let the office know. 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# PROJECT UPDATES: ISSUE 6 KEEPING YOU UP-TO-DATE AND IN-THE-KNOW

As a resident of / business owner on Patterson Street, you have been receiving regular 'Construction Corner' notices from the Town of Newmarket to keep you updated on the watermain replacement project in your area.

#### Over the past few weeks:

- Watermain testing was conducted to stringent provincial standards between the north limit of Patterson Street to Red Deer Street.
- Installation of the new watermain between Red Deer Street and Davis Drive was completed.
- All storm sewer work has now been completed.

#### Over the next few weeks:

- Water service installation will proceed between the north limit of Patterson Street to Red Deer Street.
- Watermain testing between Red Deer Street and Davis Drive will commence.

If you are planning to do any construction on your front property, please contact either Sebastian or Josh (contact information below) before you start your project. This is very important to prevent any conflicts in construction and to ensure that the work that you do will not be disturbed by the Town's project.

Intermittent road closures on Patterson Street, north of Elgin Street and between Elgin Street and Red Deer Street, are expected to start soon. These intermittent closures will last approximately 12 days (weather dependent).

You will still have access to your property. Your access may be through the north or south end of the street and detour signs will be placed to help you navigate around the closures. We appreciate your patience during these closures.

All major construction activities are expected to be completed in the fall of 2019.
