



# Grade 4 Light and Sound Workshop - Young Engineering Minds

The Light and Sound Workshop was very interesting and fun. We learned many new things about light like refraction, transparency, translucency, and opaque. While we were learning about light we did some experiments. For example, we put a pencil in a jar half-filled with water and we saw that the pencil was bending (that was a form of refraction). Another experiment was using a spectrometer to see the spectrum of colours. Then, we moved on to sound. We learned that sounds are caused by vibrations. We also learned that sound travels in waves. We then made a musical instrument out of straws. First, we had to make the part that we were going to blow on flat. Then, we had to make slits down the middle of the straw to make different notes, so we could include pitches in our instrument. This is what we did in the Light and Sound Workshop.



# MCES is now on School Cash ONLINE



### Step 1: Register

- a) Click on the School Cash Online button on our school's website at http://michaelcranny.es.yrdsb.ca/

   and select the "Get Started Today" button.
- b) Complete each of the three Registration Steps

\*For Security Reasons your password, requires 8 characters, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

### Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be automatically forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account. The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

#### Step 3: Find Student

#### NOTE: A STUDENT NUMBER IS REQUIRED

This step will connect your children to your account.

- a) Enter the School Board Name
- b) Enter the School Name
- c) Enter Your Child's Student # and Last Name
- d) Select Continue
- e) On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select Continue
- f) Your child has been added to your account

#### Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children, select "View Items For Students" option. A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed.

### Public Health Announcement - Respiratory and Enteric Illness

Student absences have increased recently within several schools in York Region, related to illnesses with respiratory and enteric symptoms.

### To protect staff, students and families from getting ill, remember to:

- Stay at home when you are sick, and keep your child home if they are sick
- Keep healthy by eating healthy foods, being physically active and ensuring your immunizations are up-todate, including the seasonal flu shot
- Avoid close contact with people who are sic
- Wash your hands often with soap and water or using an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available
- Cough and sneeze into your sleeve or a tissue, not your hand, and throw away used tissues immediately
- Avoid touching your face
- Clean and disinfect common surfaces

### Symptoms of respiratory and/or enteric illness can include:

Headache

Chills

Fever (over 38 degrees Celsius or 100 degrees Fahrenheit)

Muscle aches and fatigue

Runny nose

Sneezing

Sore throat

Watery eyes

Loss of appetite

Nausea and vomiting

Diarrhea

If you or your child are sick and do not improve, contact your health care provider.

Many viruses are commonly active at this time of year, for example norovirus and influenza (flu). Both viruses are very contagious and can be spread by contact with contaminated surfaces, such as door knobs or eating utensils.
