Parent Information

Visitors to the School

We welcome visitors and volunteers to the school. All visitors and volunteers must start their visit in the office. All visitors and volunteers are required to wear a "visitor" or "volunteer" sticker while in the school. If you are bringing an item for your child or picking up your child for an appointment, please come to the school office. A staff member will contact the classroom and ensure the item is delivered, or direct your child to the office if you are picking up your child. If possible, try to arrange appointments after school hours so that your child does not miss valuable class time.

Please notify us in writing or by telephone if someone other than the parent/guardian will pick up your child. We will only release children to adults listed as emergency contacts.

If you wish to arrange a meeting by phone or in person to speak with your child's teacher, please call the school ahead of time to arrange a convenient time. We cannot ask teachers to leave their classrooms during the instructional day to take a phone call or meet with a parent. If you are coming to school for a pre-arranged appointment, please begin your visit in the office and we will notify the teacher that you have arrived.

Are you interested in becoming more involved in your child's school? Do you want to learn more about or have input in decisions that affect his/her school life? School Council is a group of parents, formed in September, which advises the Principal on decisions that affect the entire school community, speaking on behalf of the entire parent community. So we need to hear from you!

Meetings take place monthly and everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend. Each meeting, we hear from the Principal an update on the behind-the-scenes work that staff is doing to better engage our kids, and the upcoming, co-curricular activities being planned for students like guest speakers, sports and clubs, and field trips. The Treasurer also reports on the funds raised from your generous involvement in initiatives like the pizza lunches and gift card fundraiser we decided to plan in the Fall.

We have also learned about the School Improvement Plan and analysis of EQAO data, school budget, prepared feedback for the Trustees on important Board policies that affect each one of us, and voted to decide how to spend your fundraising dollars to best serve the kids. Teachers have attended meetings as guest speakers on special topics (e.g., modern learning; music program). We have also brought forward many issues or questions for discussion (What is covered in the physical and health education curriculum? What happened to teaching cursive writing? Can we review the school dress code?) and had the opportunity to tour the Jungle Sport equipment back in the Fall and see firsthand why our kids were so excited about this program!

SCHOOL COUNCIL

The staff and students of Michael Cranny wish to thank our School Council for their hard work and dedication towards making our life at Cranny a more hands on, creative and positive place to be with their fundraising efforts.

School Council has raised through Fundscrip (just over \$800) and pizza lunches (projected to be about \$17 000 to the end of the year) close to \$18,000.00. With this school council has dispersed monies in the following ways:

Graduation - \$1000.00

Computer purchases - \$5000.00

Author visit, Forest of Reading - \$1000.00

Duck Hatching kits, Butterfly larva - \$200.00

Mental Health/Well being events/guest speakers - \$2000.00

Kindergarten Lego and manipulatives - \$500

Modern Learning classroom - \$2350.00

Music - \$4000.00

Agendas - \$650.00



As well as School Council, our graduation committee has also been fundraising. They have raised to date \$1499.00 through popcorn, cookie and frozen yogurt sales. This money will offset the graduation expenses such as trophies, Gr. 8 trip, commencement exercises, refreshments and dinner/dance for the 62 grade 8 students.

MCES Computer Science Club

What is computer science?

The science that deals with the theory and methods of processing information in digital computers, the **design** of computer **hardware** and **software**, and the **applications** of computers.

What is coding?

A system of signals used to represent letters or numbers in transmitting messages. The instructions in a **computer** program. Instructions written by a programmer in a programming language are often called source **code**.

Students may explore a variety of computer **programming languages** like Python or Scratch (created by MIT). Google CS First offers Scratch tutorials online. There are plenty of other sources for early **coding** that students may explore. Examples are code.org, Code Academy, C++, Java, and Kodable.

We also have a few Raspberry Pi kits and resources that students can investigate. Students are welcome to bring in their own items, like Arduino, with both parent and teacher permission.

Students may also wish to investigate the field of **robotics** and the mechanics behind it, through several Lego Mindstorms kits and other resources we have.

The Computer Science & Coding Club will be held <u>Thursdays</u> after school for interested students in <u>Grades 6-8</u>, <u>beginning Thursday</u>, <u>March 1st</u>. Your son/daughter will need to be picked-up promptly at 4:00pm.

Moving? A New Child Attending? Help Us Plan Ahead!

We need to recognize there is always a possibility in any given year for reorganization in the Fall, especially as enrollments increase or decline. We would ask our community for its help in this work. If you know you will be moving out of the area in the months ahead, please let the office know as soon as possible, to help us be accurate with our enrollment estimates. Similarly, if you have a child who will be joining us at the



school for the first time in Kindergarten Year 1 and have yet to register, we would ask you to do so at your earliest convenience. Thank you for your support in helping us plan for continued success at the school.

Kindergarten Registration For September 2018

Michael Cranny is accepting Kindergarten Registration forms for September 2018. Children who were born in 2014 are eligible for Junior Kindergarten. Children born in 2013 and not currently attending a public school are eligible for Senior Kindergarten in September. Registration forms are available on the Board's Website: www.yrdsb.ca.

As space is limited, some children may be required to attend a school outside their neighbourhood. Please note that all required documentation must be submitted and complete in order for your child to be enrolled. You and your child must also live within the school boundary. Again, space is limited, so please don't delay in having your child registered. The following documentation is required:

- Proof of Child's Age (Birth Certificate or Passport)
- Proof of Residency (for child and parent/guardian)
- Citizenship and immigration status (for child and parent/quardian where applicable)
- Direction of School Support form (if applicable)
