French Immersion Information Sessions and Registrations

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at Michaëlle Jean P.S. on **January 15**, **2015** at **7** p.m. FI registration will begin **January 16**, **2015**.

In order to streamline the registration process, parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students currently attending a YRDSB school and entering Grade 1 in September 2014, who are wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call their current school office and request an Office Index Card short version. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to Michaëlle Jean P.S. to register between January 16 and February 13, 2015. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.


YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools. More information is available on the Board's website: www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca. Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

Important Reminders

Food items for Holiday Celebrations

Please remember that due to severe food allergies and in keeping up with our healthy schools objective and goal, we ask parents not to send any food items for students to share with their classmates during holiday celebrations.

Don't forget to also pack spoons or forks with your child's lunch as we may not have any extra utensils to give out to students.

School Policies and Procedures

Weather Watch

All students are expected to go out for every recess unless the administration decides after consulting the Richmond Hill Weather Network that weather conditions are so poor that it would be detrimental for them to be outdoors. Students are to come to school ready for winter and prepared to be outdoors up to 40 minutes after lunch. We always monitor the weather and, in extreme conditions e.g. wind chill; we keep the students indoors or shorten the recess breaks.



Please make sure that your children are dressed properly for our invigorating Canadian winter days. It is advisable for students to bring extra pants and socks. A change is often necessary due to the wet and cold weather of the winter months. To avoid adding to our clothing collection in the Lost and Found, please be sure to label all articles of clothing. Boots, hats, mitts/gloves, scarves, and snow pants for the children will help make recess an enjoyable time.



We often receive requests from parents asking us to keep their children indoors during recess times because they are not feeling well. Unfortunately, we do not have the staff or facilities to supervise students who are sick or still recovering from an illness. Students with heavy colds, etc., which are serious enough to prevent them from participating in physical education, recesses or other outdoor activities, should remain at home until their condition improves. This will benefit the students concerned and prevent the spread of illness to others.



Winter Weather at Michaelle Jean P.S.

We advise our students that there are many ways to enjoy playing in the snow, to have fun and still be safe. Children can enjoy the snow by playing in it, making snow angels, and making snow creatures and snow forts.



Throwing and kicking snow can result in serious injury to others and that is the reason it is not permitted at school. We ask that you reinforce with your children how to play safely in the snow. Please be advised there will be consequences if your child throws or kicks snow.

Important Bus Cancellation Information

School bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements. <u>Please remember any scheduled school lunches (pizza, Sub) will also be cancelled on snow days.</u>

Since bussing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m. or earlier, all cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to ensure the safety of our students. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region. Please access local media outlets after 6:00 a.m. to receive cancellation information.. A bus cancellation message will also be available at www.schoolbuscity.com and by calling 1-877-330-3001.

If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will need to be picked up at the end of the day.

School Policies and Procedures Con't

Parking at MJPS

The bus loop in front of the school is a Fire Route and no cars can be left there at any time. You may park on the west side of Shirley Drive and take the paved walkway to the front door and walk your child to the fenced area at the north side of the school. The entrance to the school parking lot is closed to all vehicles except for staff from 7:45 a.m. to 8:05 a.m. and from 2:20 p.m. to 2:45 p.m. to allow for the busses to safely enter and exit the school. Please do not block the driveways as this prevents school staff from entering the school on time.

We ask all parents to support us in ensuring the safe arrival and departure of all our students. Also, please remember that students are not permitted to meet parents either at the front of the school or inside the school at the end of the day. Students are to wait behind the fence facing the parking lot where there is teacher supervision until a parent/guardian has arrived to pick them up.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

Students who bring valuable personal property to school do so at their own risk. The school has no storage facilities for valuable items and we cannot take care of these items for students. This includes toys that are precious to our students. The School Board or school will not assume any responsibility for lost or stolen items. We ask that all valuable items be left at home.

Late Arrivals

Arriving late impacts on instructional time, disrupts the classroom routine and impacts on school achievement. We track late arrivals and the Attendance Councilor may be contacted if this is a reoccurring pattern. Please ensure that your child arrives to school on time.

Lost and Found Items

Our lost and found bin is overflowing with coats, mitts, hats, lunch bags etc. If your child has lost anything recently, please visit the school to look through the bin. Any unclaimed items will be donated to charity by December 19, 2014, Thank you.

Pick up and Drop Off

Please remember that only buses are allowed in the bus loop between 7:45 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. and between 2:00 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. This is imperative for your children's safety! Also please remember that students may only enter the school from the school yard; only this entry area is supervised. The pathway on the south side of the building is out of bounds. Also, if you plan to pick up your child early from school, you must call ahead and arrive at the school before 2:00 p.m. Requests after this time will be difficult to honoure as it disrupts our dismissal procedure and our office staff may not be able to retrieve your message
