


Le caractère compte ... Character Matters!

- Remember the "Golden Rule" Treat others how you would like to be treated.








If you have a child entering Kindergarten in September (born in 2014), please go to your local elementary school to register your child.

BUS CANCELLATIONS DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER

You must **notify** the **school** if your child will be **absent** due to **bus cancellations**.

SCHOOLS REMAIN OPEN

During an Inclement Weather Day, the school is open and alternate programming may be provided depending on the number of students in attendance on this day.

PIZZA/PITA LUNCH & KIDS' KITCHEN

If Pizza or Pita Lunches are scheduled on an Inclement Weather Day they will be *cancelled and rescheduled*.

All Kids' Kitchen orders will be delivered, unless cancelled by phone **before 8:00AM** on the day of delivery.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Students who come to school on a Snow Day may be dropped off and picked up through the parking lot loop. Pick up will begin at 2:00 pm. Please pick up your child by 2:20 pm.

School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not
 operate.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to
 and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not
 operate in the afternoon. Therefore, students transported to school by parents will require the same
 transportation home.

SNAP® BACK

ADAPTING THE SNAP® PROGRAM FOR BLACK AND AFRICAN CANADIAN KIDS ...

WHAT IS THE SNAP® PROGRAM?

The SNAP* Program is a gender-sensitive, evidence-based early intervention program that teaches children with disruptive behaviour problems, and their parents, how to stop and think before they act and make better choices "in the moment". Developed by the Child Development Institute (CDI), the Program helps children between the ages of 6 and 11 to learn self-regulation, self-control and problem-solving skills. Children who enter the program may have engaged in aggressive, anti-social behaviour, and / or have come into contact with authority figures at school or in the community. SNAP® is a multi-faceted program designed to assist middle years children and their families, including working with their school and community to help keep kids in school and out of trouble. SNAP® is not recommended for children on the Autism Spectrum or with significant developmental delays.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Service providers, advocates, educators, social workers, parents and anyone else who has had experience with Black children aged 6 to 11 who have demonstrated or experienced challenges with self-regulation and/or disruptive behaviour.


WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

We will share an overview of the SNAP® Program. You will share your experience and knowledge about Black children age 6 to 11 and provide your input into how the program materials could be adapted from a cultural identity and anti-Black racism lens. Dinner will be provided

Buddhism	Baha'i Faith
Feb. 16 – Lunar New Year the day after the new moon, marks the beginning of the new lunar year. It is the year of the Dog. Irrespective of their religion or country, all Chinese, Vietnamese and many Koreans celebrate the cultural aspect of this day. This is the beginning of year 4716 in the Chinese calendar. It is a time for renewal and personal relationships, and pledges of prosperity.	Feb. 26-Mar. 1 – Intercalary Days are four days (five in a leap year) that do not belong to any month. They are days of celebration, gift-giving, hospitality and charitable works.
Christianity	Hinduism
Feb. 14 – Ash Wednesday (Western Calendar) is the beginning of Lent, the forty-day period (excluding Sundays) of prayer, repentance and self-denial that precedes Easter. It is a reminder of the days Jesus spent alone in the wilderness. Feb. 19 – First Day of Lent (Eastern Calendar), which is the great fast, is the last six weeks of a ten-week period before Easter. This day is also known as Clean Monday. Some Eastern Churches may start Lent a week before on February 12.	Feb. 14 – Mahashivaratri (or Shivaratri, "Great Shiva Night") is a special night of prayer. Devotees sing the praises of Shiva, one of the major Hindu deities.
