As our school staff begins organizing classes for September 2017, it is valuable for parents to understand the process for student placement decisions. The ultimate goal in all of our efforts is to provide an optimum learning environment for our students. Classroom teachers and the special education teacher as well as the principal and vice principal are involved in the class placement process. A great deal of time and consideration goes into placing students in the most positive learning environment possible. Classes at each grade level are formed using a variety of important criteria such as:

- a range of performance levels within each class, taking into account students' learning styles, strengths
 and needs, attitudes, and work habits;
- gender balance in each class;
- promoting positive social relationships while minimizing unproductive association.

<u>Please note that combined grade classes are very common in our system and will be part of our organization for 2017-18.</u>

If you would like to share in this process, we encourage you to contribute your thoughts in writing by May 19th for our consideration. Please address and forward your letter to the office, sharing information about how your child learns best. Each new year brings opportunities for all students to expand their circle of friends. For this reason, class placement decisions based on friendships will not be considered. As well, please do not ask for a specific teacher. Letters that contain requests for specific teachers will be returned to you. Teaching assignments are continually adjusted, often into the summer months. As always, we appreciate your understanding as we work together for the benefit of all of our students.

Public Health Immunization Information

In the 2017/18 school year, York Region Public Health will visit all elementary schools to provide school immunization clinics to Grade 7 students. The clinics offer vaccines for Hepatitis B, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) and Meningococcal A, C, Y, W-135 at no cost.

Under the Immunization of School Pupils Act, meningococcal vaccine is required for school attendance, unless an exemption is filed with public health. Hepatitis B and HPV vaccines are recommended, but not required for school attendance.

Parents of students entering Grade 7 in fall 2017 will receive consent forms in the mail in June. Please complete the consent form and return it to York Region Public Health to allow your child to participate in the immunization clinics. Detailed instructions can be found on the forms and accompanying letter. If the consent form is not completed, your child will not be able to receive vaccines at the clinic.

Parents and guardians who do not consent should still complete the forms and return them, indicating that you do not authorize York Region Public Health to immunize your child.

Did you know? If your child has missed a required vaccination on Ontario's routine immunization schedule, he/she can receive the vaccine at one of York Region Public Health's Community Immunization Clinics. These evening clinics are offered throughout the summer, giving students the opportunity to catch up before

No Scents Please

The York Region District School Board is committed to a safe, healthy and respectful workplace and learning environment for staff, students, and all other persons who are invited to or who work on Board property.

According to the Lung Association, 15 to 20 per cent of the Canadian population has respiratory issues, such as asthma, emphysema, bronchitis, and allergies.

Several hundred chemicals can be used to make ONE scented product. Fragrances are found in a wide range of products. Common scented products include perfume, cologne, aftershave, deodorant, soap, shampoo, hairspray, body spray, makeup and powders. Examples of other products with added scents include air fresheners, fabric softeners, laundry detergents, cleaners, carpet deodorizers, facial tissues, and candles. Reactions to these chemicals may include shortness of breath/wheezing, headaches and migraines, nausea and muscle pain, and cold-like symptoms.

Staff, students and all other persons who are invited to or who work on Board property are asked to be considerate of those who are sensitive to fragrant chemicals by voluntarily refraining from chemical-based scented products and replacing them with unscented alternatives. This will reduce the use of fragranced products in our environment. Thank you!



HOLIDAYS AND OBSERVANCES

BAHA'I FAITH

May 23: **Declaration of the Bab.** On this day in 1844 C.E., a man known as the Bab, a title which means "the Gate," announced his mission as a manifestation of God whose purpose was to prepare the world for the coming of the promised manifestation of all religions, Baha'u'llah. The Baha'i calendar is dated from this day. Work and academic studies are suspended on this day.

May 28: **Ascension of Baha'u'llah.** This date marks the passing in 1892 C.E. of Baha'u'llah, the prophet-founder of the Baha'i Faith, near Haifa, in the Holy Lands. Work and academic studies are suspended on this day.

BUDDHISM

May 10: **Wesak** is celebrated on the full moon. It is considered the most auspicious day of the year, celebrating Buddha's Birth, Enlightenment, and Final Demise. In Canada, many Buddhist groups join together to celebrate the three festivals of Buddha's life as one event. They do this on the day of the fourth full moon after the lunar new year, or the Sunday closest to that day. This is usually around mid-May.

CHRISTIANITY

May 25: **Ascension Day** (Western) marks Jesus' ascension into heaven and is observed through prayers and music. It occurs forty days after Easter.

ISLAM

May 12: **Nisfu-Shaban** is known as the Night of Forgiveness or repentance. Many Muslims spend the preceding night in prayer seeking God's guidance.

May 27: **Ramadhan** is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. All Muslims who are physically able, fast during this month abstaining from food and drink each day from dawn to sunset. The beginning of Ramadhan depends on the sighting of the moon on the previous evening.

JUDAISM

May 31 - June 1: **Shavuot** celebrates the Israelites receiving the Torah.

WICCA

May 1: **Beltane** meaning "May", the greening of the Earth, blossom time, when Goddess and God are reunited. Beltane has long been celebrated with feasts and rituals.
