#### Important Bus Cancellation Information

School bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Since bussing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m. or earlier, all cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to ensure the safety of our students. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region.

Please access local media outlets after 6:00 a.m. to receive cancellation information.. A bus cancellation message will also be available at <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> and by calling 1-877-330-3001.

If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will need to be picked up at the end of the day.

#### Reporting Process for Students in Elementary Schools

All assessment, evaluation and reporting in Ontario schools are based on the policies and practices described in *Growing Success: Assessment, Evaluation, and Reporting In Ontario Schools, Covering Grades 1 to 12.* There are three formal reporting periods in elementary schools where teachers share student's information regarding their learning and achievement of their learning skills and work habits and the Ontario curriculum expectations:

Interviews to be held: November 13 (evening) and/or November 14 (PA day - am)

Elementary First Provincial Report Card.......Report to be sent home: week of February 9, 2015

Elementary Final Provincial Report Card......Report to be sent home: week of June 22, 2015

#### Elementary Progress Report Card (Grades 1-8)

The purpose of this report card is to communicate the progress your child has been making since the beginning of the school year in each subject. The progress report also indicates how well your child is demonstrating the various learning skills and work habits and identifies areas where you may be able to support your child in achieving success this year. This report is <u>not</u> an evaluation or a record of achievement levels. It reflects preliminary observations of your child's learning to date. It is our hope that this report will serve as a central part of rich discussions between home and school.

#### Parent-Teacher Interviews

To facilitate the discussion of report cards, we will be holding teacher-parent interviews again this year. Interviews will take place on Thursday, November 13th in the evening and on Friday, November 14th in the morning. Interviews will be 15 minutes in duration. You should have received information about how to schedule appointments with your child's teachers. Please return the forms promptly to your child's teacher as appointments will be scheduled on a first come first serve basis.
