

School Procedures

IMPORTANT REMINDER

Visitors Must Sign In

For the safety of all our students and in

accordance with the School Board's Safe Schools Policy, all parents must check in at the office. This includes when volunteering for the lunch programs.

Spoons and Forks

Parents, please remember to pack a spoon or a fork in your child's lunch as we do not provide cutlery.



Lunches and Allergy Awareness

Please remember that we are a Nut Free School. We have many students with severe allergies to nuts and nut byproducts. Do not send any food items with your child(ren) that contain or may have come in contact with any nut or nut byproduct.



School Procedures Con't...

Pick up and Drop Off

Please remember that only buses are allowed in the bus loop between 7:45 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. and between 2:00 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. This is imperative for your children's safety! Also please remember that students may only enter the school from the school yard; only this entry area is supervised. The pathway on the south side of the building is out of bounds. If you plan to pick up your child early from school, you must call ahead and arrive at the school



before 2:00 p.m. Requests after this time will not be honoured as it disrupts our dismissal procedure and our office staff may not be able to retrieve your message in time.

Police Checks-Vulnerable Sector Screening

All parents wishing to volunteer for any activities in schools must have a valid police check. Such volunteer activities include helping with pizza or sub lunches, accompanying classes on field trips, assisting in the library or anything that would include parent involvement with students. If you require a police check, please obtain the appropriate "Vulnerable Sector Screening" form from the York Regional Police. If you already have a police check, please ensure that you complete an "Annual Offence Declaration" which must be completed each year.

Clothing and Footwear

Please make sure your child has a pair of indoor shoes for school with non-marking soles. Outdoor shoes track in mud and dirt and it can be very uncomfortable for the children to wear wet shoes and socks all day. Every student must have a clean pair of sneakers for their physical education classes, which they can also wear as indoor shoes. Please help your child achieve success in physical education and help us keep the school clean.

Please also send in a change of clothing for your child. Children often need to change into clean/dry clothes during the day.

Punctuality

As we move into October and the routines are set, we continue to thank you for getting your child(ren) to school on time. We strongly urge our students to arrive at the school prior to the 8:00 am bell. Our opening activities are important as we review routines, events and information students need to know to begin their day.

Recess Breaks

Students are expected to be outdoors for recess. If the weather is very cold, stormy or rainy, an indoor routine is followed. Generally speaking, if your child is too sick to go out at recess, then your child is too sick to attend school. Requests to stay in at recess or lunch cannot be accommodated as we do not have staff to supervise indoors.
