SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

Our school organization for this year remains <u>tentative</u>. As you are aware, the Ministry of Education has mandated a hard cap of 20 students in each of the primary (1-3) classes. Since this is a hard cap, there is little flexibility to increase the limit above 20.

In French Immersion we have the additional challenge of children who are registered but do not arrive as well as all the late registrations that arrive the first week. Class size will be closely monitored by our administration over the next 3 weeks and is it very probable that we will need to reorganize. We will update the community of any changes to our organization at a later date which will occur on the PA day September 22nd.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES

PICK UP AND DROP OFF ROUTINES

We ask all parents to support us in ensuring the safe arrival and departure of all our children. WE ENCOURAGE ALL PARENTS TO PUT THEIR CHILDREN ON THE SCHOOL BUS IF THEY ARE ENTITLED TO IT. We would like to remind parents that buses have priority to enter the school for the safety of all our students and because the buses have to make two stops, one at our school and one at Beverley Acres every morning and every afternoon. The entrance to the school will be closed to all vehicles except for buses between 7:45 a.m. and 8:10 a.m. and between 2:00 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. This procedure is necessary to allow for the busses to safely enter and exit the school.

Parking continues to be a concern. We have a large staff and therefore we need most of the parking spots on the school lot for our teachers, office staff and caretaking. It is for this reason that we encourage you to park on Shirley Drive and walk to the school with your child.

We appreciate your support as we continue to refine parking at our school. Also, if you plan to pick up your child early from school, you must send your child's teacher a note and come to the office to sign out your child as well. If you call the office, we may not get this message until much later so a note to the teacher is preferable.

No Parking in the loop at the Front of the School

Please do not park in the loop at the front of the school. This is the Fire Route and we require that this area remain open in the event that emergency vehicles need access.

VISITORS-Any person entering the school must report to the office

For the protection and safety of our children and staff, everyone must adhere to this rule. Please note that visitors to our school and parent volunteers must wear a *Visitor Badge* obtained at the office and must sign in the *Visitor's Log Book*.

SAFE WELCOME PROGRAM- FRONT DOORS

For student safety, our front doors will continue to be locked with the following exceptions:

-The school front door will be **unlocked** between the time of the dismissal bell and when the main office closes.

-The front door to access the childcare program will be **unlocked** after the main office closes.

-Classroom doors to a childcare program or an after school activity will be locked when these programs are in session and the front door is unlocked.

-An appropriate door is to be **unlocked 15 minutes** before a permit begins, and is to be **locked 15 minutes** after the permit begins.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES

LUNCHES AND ALLERGIES AWARENESS

Nutrition is very important. Please help your children make good food choices for their lunches. We discourage sharing of lunches because of food allergies. We continue to need your cooperation in keeping **the school a nut-safe area**. As we have explained in the past, we are doing all we can to protect the lives of some of our students who are deathly allergic to peanut and nut products. We need your help and vigilance in assisting us in providing a safe and healthy environment for all. In keeping with this policy, **please do not send food to school with your child to celebrate his or her birthday**. We will acknowledge birthdays by announcing them on the morning announcements and providing each student with a birthday pencil.

CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR

Please make sure your child has a pair of **indoor shoes** for school. Outdoor shoes track in mud and dirt and it can be very uncomfortable for the children to wear wet shoes and socks all day. Every student **must** have a clean pair of running shoes, with non-marking soles, for their physical education classes, which they can also wear as indoor shoes. Please help your child achieve success in physical education and help us keep the school clean. Please also send in a change of clothing for your child. Children often need to change into clean/dry clothes during the day.



STUDENT BUSSING ELIGIBILITY

PERSONAL PROPERTY



Students who bring valuable personal property to school do so at their own risk. The school has no storage facilities for valuable items and we cannot take care of these items for students. The School Board or school will not assume any responsibility for lost or stolen items. We ask that all valuable items are left at home.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION



Please provide non-marking running shoes, shorts or comfortable pants for your child's gym days. As well we recommend for safety reasons that jewellery be removed the day of gym classes.

Did you know that students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career?

Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.
