


College Applications: Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma
 - 30 credits
 - Literacy requirement
 - 40 hours of community service
- Grade 12 English
 - ENG4U (for degree programs)
 - ENG4C (for diploma or advanced diploma programs)
- Program specific requirements
 - □ CPR, First Aid, Criminal Record check





College Application: Next Steps

AFTER YOU APPLY. WHAT'S NEXT?

- Verify Your Grades. Check the Education section of your application after mid-term and final marks have been sent in. Report any errors to your Guidance Counsellor.
- Update Your Application. If you need to make changes to your application, such as adding or removing a program, or update your account information, such as your address or phone number, log back in to your ontariocolleges.ca account.
- Confirm your offer. Colleges begin sending out offers February 1.
- Apply for financial aid. Once you've confirmed an offer, it's time to start thinking about paying for college. There are many financial aid options available to you, including OSAP, scholarships, bursaries and grants.



College Application: Important Information

- ☐ The application processing fee is \$95.
- An application allows you 5 program choices, with no more than 3 at any one college.
- Your username is **permanent**. It will not change if you update your contact email address.
- You cannot change your first name, last name, date of birth, OEN number or academic data. To make changes to your demographic information, contact ontariocolleges.ca. If there are problems with your grades, talk to your guidance counsellor.
- Provide a valid email address. It is the primary method of communication.



College Application: Important Dates

February 1, 2020:

- Equal Consideration Date. Applications received and paid for on or before this date are considered equally by the colleges. Applications received after this date are considered on a first come basis.
- <u>Earliest Offer Date.</u> Feb 1st is the first day colleges **may** begin sending offers of admission.

May 1, 2020:

Confirmation Date. Most offers of admission must be confirmed by this date.

June 2020:

□ <u>Tuition Deposit Due.</u> Amounts and deadlines vary by college.

College Application: Transfer Options

- Most common type of transfer is from a college diploma or advanced diploma to a degree program in college or university.
 - Usually involves transfer of a block of credits into a specific point in a degree program
- Colleges have begun to develop transfer pathways from college certificate programs to diploma programs, and from diploma programs to advanced diploma programs.
- Colleges have also developed Graduate Certificate programs.
 - These programs require a university degree to enter

College Application: Private Career Colleges

- Many private colleges and career training centres across Canada.
 - Institutions are usually very specific
 - Time savings
- Make sure career colleges are accredited

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma
 - 30 credits
 - Literacy requirement
 - □ 40 hours community service
- ☐ Grade 12 English: ENG4U
- 5 other grade 12 courses at the U or M level
 - Some programs require specific courses
- Other application requirements
 - Supplementary application (e.g. Queen's PSE)
 - Portfolio, audition, interview, test



University Application: Important Information

- ☐ The application processing fee is \$150
- An application allows you 3 program choices, with no more than 3 at any one university.
 - Additional programs may be selected at \$50 per additional choice
- Be aware of choice restrictions
 - University of Toronto allows only 1 choice for Scarborough and Mississauga campuses, and no more than 2 choices for St. George
- □ Take advantage of Alternate Offers
 - Co-op to non Co-op at UTSC
 - BBA to Economics at Wilfrid Laurier



University Application: Important Dates

January 15, 2020:

Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.

February 4, 2020:

Recommended last date to make changes to your application.

May 27, 2020:

 Latest date you can expect a response to your application for admission.

June 1, 2020:

The earliest date you may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).


