




- Students engage in a range of enjoyable and significant experiences that foster growth in areas of Creativity, Activity and Service



Timetable Considerations

- Students have a full timetable
- Students do not have space in their timetable for spares or non-IB courses
- Students are only able to take two Sciences
 - One Science is HL level and one Science is SL level
 - Students cannot take all three Science subjects during day school

IB Programme Fees

\$3,090 Total

- \$257.50 in Grade 9
 - the Grade 9 fee is payable at time of acceptance of offer of admission
- \$360.50 in Grade 10
- \$1,236 per year in both Grade 11 and Grade 12
- These fees cannot be used as tax deductions












School Locator



School Year on School Locator



Step 2: Personal Portfolio: Artifacts

For the purpose of this task, an artifact is a visual or graphic representation of an experience.

Examples of experiences may include:

- a life event
- a responsibility you have taken
- a community event
- an initiative you have demonstrated
- the practice of a tradition
- a personal accomplishment
- participation in an activity
- involvement in the creation of something





Personal Portfolio: Purpose

- The portfolio provides an opportunity for applicants to share something about themselves
- When you are deciding what to include, select experiences/artifacts that are meaningful to YOU
- This is a PERSONAL Portfolio
 - We are hoping to learn about the <u>applicant</u>
 - To help us do this, we expect students to work independently and be honest





Personal Portfolio: Next Steps

- For now, students can think about what experiences they would like to include, and how they might want to represent them as artifacts
- Information about submitting the Personal Portfolio will be sent to the student's email address after 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5, 2024.
 - For YRDSB students this address will be their YRDSB GAPPS account
 - For students who are not currently in the YRDSB system, the email will be sent to the student email address entered on the EDSBY application form

- In the email you will receive:
 - a reminder of the instructions for completing the Personal Portfolio
 - a template for formatting the Personal Portfolio as a Google Slide presentation
 - instructions about how to submit your finished
 Personal Portfolio through a Google Form

- We encourage students to consider the guiding questions and consider their responses carefully
- Remember to review the template for tips on how to format each slide
- Once it is submitted, students will not be able to edit the content

Assessment Tasks: Part 1

- During the in-person assessment task, the teacher will share a prompt (e.g. a picture or a quotation)
- Students will have 40 minutes to plan, write and edit their response to the prompt
- The student response should be written in full sentences and organized in paragraph form
- Students' responses will be assessed for both the ideas and the clear communication of those ideas





Assessment Tasks: Parts 2 and 3

- The second task is a Math assessment.
- Students will have 25 minutes to answer 15 multiple-choice Math questions.


- The third task is a French assessment.
- Students will have 20 minutes to answer 15 multiple-choice French questions.





Assessment Day Logistics


- Students are required to bring:

 - Dictionaries
 - Recording Devices
