

Important Information for Graduating Students

Students who have received an offer of admission from either college and/ or university are reminded that offers must be accepted online (on the OCAS website for college programs and the OUAC website for university programs) by the <u>stated deadline</u> or the offer will expire.

Qualified Ontario secondary school students applying for admission to an Ontario university who did not receive an offer of admission can inquire about possible openings in other programs or at other Ontario universities through the OUAC from June 5 to August 29, 2014. Students should call 519-823-1063 or visit www.ouac.n.ca/ais/ for more information. Students who are still interested in applying to college should check for program availability on www.ontariocolleges.ca.

There will be a release of grades and other identifying information (name, date of birth, home address, telephone number, OEN, student number) for all students in Grade 12 on the dates listed below using secure transmission technology to the Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS). These data transmissions will be done in support of all post-secondary applications to college and university.

OUAC (University) Transmission Dates

July 8, 2014 semester two final marks and proof of graduation August 29, 2014 final marks from summer school

OCAS (College) Transmission Dates

July 4, 2014 semester two final marks and proof of graduation August 22, 2014 final marks from summer school

Community Involvement Activities

Students who plan to complete their community involvement hours over the summer are reminded that they must submit a completed *Notification and Completion of Community Involvement Activities Form* for school approval *prior* to the commencement of the volunteer activity. This is required to ensure students are covered by the Board's insurance plan for liability losses arising from the completion of 40 hours of community involvement activities.

Summer School Information

When a student completes a course but receives a failing grade, credit recovery may be an appropriate next step to meet course expectations that were not achieved initially. This year, the following summer school Credit Recovery programs will be offered through the YRDSB:

Reinforcement Program (2 week program)

This program is designed for students who were not successful in obtaining a grade 9/10 compulsory subject and/or a grade 11 math course during the school year. Students must be recommended by the school, and may take a maximum of two reinforcement courses during the summer.

Differentiated Support Model (flexible timeline within a 2 Week period) This program provides opportunities for students in grades 9-12 to recover credits in subjects not addressed in the summer school reinforcement program (e.g., grade 11 or 12 compulsory subjects). Students recommended

for this program will work independently to complete missed assignments or projects under the supervision of the summer school credit recovery teacher.

Acceleration Courses (4 weeks in length) are intended for those students who wish to take a new course for credit, or to upgrade a previous mark. Students may take a maximum of <u>one</u> acceleration course during the summer.

NOTE-Special Education students with an Individual Education Plan are required to submit a copy of their IEP to their Summer School teacher in order to receive the accommodations they are entitled to.



Science

It is with pleasure that the Department of Science reports on many highlights of accomplishment of department goals and on student achievement for this academic year. As one of the largest departments at MMHS, we continue to offer curricula of a high quality that prepares all our students for continued and sustainable success in their various programs ranging from specialist programs (SHSM) into the workplace to post-secondary studies in Canadian colleges and universities. Our students continue to excel under the tutelage and guidance of our dedicated teachers. We continue to implement systemic and curriculum changes according to the YRDSB and the Ontario Ministry of Education, respectively. We will be the FIRST department at MMHS to offer Pre Ap course in Academic Science (SNC1D15) at MMHS in September 2014. Our expectation is to build on this precedence and to extend our Pre-AP into Academic G10 Science. The pedagogical thinking behind building our Pre-Ap Science platform is to offer our students an avenue to explore (in G11 and 12) how a First-Year University course is taught, discussed and disseminated (rolled out) and provide clear advantages in further preparing students to be self-motivated and autonomous learners. The instructor for the SNC1D5 course will be Mrs. K. Reid (Department Head).

We are also very proud to report on the achievements of various students in four different external competitions. Abhina Sreeskantharaj was our National Biology Scholar winner placing in the 96th percentile of the top 5% across Canada in the University of Toronto National Biology Competition for 2014. She was also MMHS's overall winner in addition to placing in the 95th percentile in the University of Waterloo's Chem 13 News exam (Grade 12). Jacky Xao was our winner in the University of Waterloo's Avagardo's Chemistry exam (Grade 11) scoring in the 96th percentile. Mrs. Reid, Mr. Chung, and Mrs. Qureshi prepared these students respectively.

I would like to extend my personal gratitude to all members of the Science Team for their dedication, tenacity and professionalism as they continue to deliver science programs of the highest quality. The input of Mrs. Qureshi, Mrs. Gerendas, Mr. Kong, Mr. Leung, Mr. Chung, Ms. Kratochvil, Mr. Brake Mr. Kyriakou, and Mr. Lee is highly valued. In our instructional and pedagogical Teams we have been proactive in our plans to ensure that student success is of paramount importance in our teaching practice and in our learning platforms.
