- Kathariny explained about Math Flowchart/Pathway, Math Help Room during lunch, Destreaming math support teacher role, Peer Tutors and volunteer hours, Math Contests (Pascal/Cayley Fermat on Feb 22, Euclid Contest-April 4 and Fryer/Galois/Hypatia-April 5), and Math Club: MMHS Math Society- In this math club they practice for competitions and solve challenging problems under a timed environment
- Questions about EQAO and new formatting and removal of long answer questions from EQAO
- Questions about courses and which ones shifted to de-streamed and the consequences
 of this move on students and their progress
- Discussion about motivating all students not just IB students to join the math club and math help

Teacher Report

- Teacher report by Kamla:
- Report about visual arts:
 - Students from Personal Alternative Education updated and extended the frames at the front of the school. The first showing in the frames involves Grade 9-12 Visual Arts students representing the school community with a series of portraits in diverse stylistic approaches.
- Gr. 12 Photo students have an upcoming show at Gallery 44, Centre for Contemporary Photography, entitled EMERGENCE from February 10-20, with a closing reception from noon-3 pm on February 20, Family Day.
- LLC in the library: 1. Readathon last month was a huge success: Over \$400 was raised toward our Library Bursary, which will help one of our more financially needy students offset postsecondary costs. Applications become available in early May.
- We also hope to run a second Readathon in later April/early May to add even more funds.
- Black Excellence Month is almost here. We welcome your participation and ideas. A planning meeting will take place in the back of the Library on Tuesday at lunch (noon).
- A compilation of student work was shown with black and white images and explained about each piece.

School Council Actions

- Sunita explained the survey results that were open to parents of students from grades 9-12
- Only 23 parents participated, the highest participation from grade 9 parents.
- External Speakers" was the top 1st choice (43.5%)
- "Awareness sessions for YRDSB/Tools" was the next top choice (39%)
- Parents want to see more talks about university education and better parenting strategies
- Overall, more motivation is needed to get parents engaged in the school and tell the school more specifics about what type of workshops they want the school to run i.e University applications and explanations

- The next step will be to have a parenting-themed session using the PRO grant
- SC can work with guidance on tools and awareness
- Seema is proposing a strongmindstrongkids.org workshop for parent and caregiver master class in stress management, which will cost 500\$ for 100 participants, discussing whether it should be a hybrid, in-person, or entirely online.
- Looking more at survey results and seeing what type of workshops parents want i.e new and uprising industries, possibly even using some of the parent council members to conduct the workshops themselves
- Seema will be following up on the strongmindstrongkids.org workshops
- Decision to pilot have the March School Council Meeting begin at 6:30 pm and also potentially hybrid in order to have more students participate
