- IB will be conducting their evaluation visit this month. Staff, students and parents will meet IB Examiners. Parent session will take place on Sept 28, 3:30-4:00 pm.

- Grade 11/12 IB students attended an IB orientation at Green Acres, where they discussed CAS, EE and TOK, as well as collaborative leadership

- Reviewed roles:

- Chair Works collaboratively with principal to set agendas, chairs meetings and works collaboratively with members to assign duties
- Vice-Chair supports and assists the Chair
- Secretary records attendance and takes minutes, and shares minutes with principal for distribution
- Treasurer manages finances and reports on accounts
- Members participate and encourage participation, and act as eyes and ears of the community
