A Message from the Library Information Center

<u>Freedom to Read Week</u>: February 23 to March 1, is Freedom to Read Week, an annual event that encourages Canadians to think about and reaffirm their commitment to the intellectual freedom guaranteed them under the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. To commemorate Freedom to Read's thirtieth anniversary, some writers cast a look back over the past three decades and reviewed 30 'challenged 'publications. To celebrate our Library displayed a variety of challenged books that are in our collection, including To Kill a Mockingbird and The Golden Compass. In the past, these books were challenged for either racial or religious reasons.

<u>Reading Buddies</u>: Once a week, Ms. Spyridakis's JK/SK students buddy up with Mme Hsueh's Grade 6FI students to engage in a period of reading in the library. 'Big' buddies support 'little' buddies by reading to them, asking questions, having them predict events, taking picture walks, making connections, visualizing and listening to them read. Big buddies have an opportunity to practise their English, while little buddies have the chance to engage in reading. Reading together is fun!!

<u>Student Learning:</u> Evidence of student learning displayed in our library has been enjoyed by everyone. Appreciation goes out to the Ms. Llewellyn's class for their work on 'I Have a Dream' wish, celebrating Black History Month. Landscape/cityscape artwork created by Mme Tantalo's Grade 7FI art students attracted the attention of library visitors. Thanks to Mme Chan and Mme Momeni's grade 4FI students for their wonderful 3D projects on Ancient Civilizations. Students have enjoyed admiring, discussing and reading the creative books made by Mme Pakjou's Grade 2FI class.

<u>Sochi Olympics 2014:</u> During the Sochi Olympics 2014, the Milliken community watched our Olympic Wall, in the library hall, collect medals that were won by our Canadian Olympic athletes. We all took part in celebrating Canadian successes. Students from Mme Fejer and Mme Davydova's Grade 3FI classes enhanced the wall with pictogram artwork showcasing the various Olympic sports. Ms. Irwin's Grade 8 class demonstrated their learning of using materials to create intricate miniature sculptures of Olympic athletes, which communicated a feeling or action inspired by the artwork of Alberto Giacometti.

Grade 7 & 8 Summer School



After School - time to get active!

Children need at least 60 minutes of physical activity daily to live healthier, happier lives, yet many only spend 14 minutes doing heart pumping activities after school. Getting outside can make a difference - kids who play outside after school get 2000 more steps a day (the equivalent of walking an additional two kilometres) than those who do not play outside.

- Use active transportation such as walking and cycling as much as possible
- Restrict television viewing and video/computer games
- Investigate the availability of programs at your local Parks and Recreation Departments
