
The next School council meeting will be on Thursday, May 21st at 7:00pm in School Library.

We were lucky enough to be invited as part of a ministry pilot project for "Inspire Learning Outside" in one of our kindergarten classes. It was put together by Tanya Murray an Outdoor Ed teacher with the YRDSB. We planned two days of activities, an inquiry, and play-based learning all for the outdoors. We began our journey meeting Ms. Murray and took her to all our special outdoor learning places.

When Ms. Murray returned we began our day looking at a variety of county and trail maps. The students' thinking was recorded and we discussed planning out our own large scale map of our school space. We continued to explore our favourite places and place them on the map using mixed media. This map now hangs just outside our door for all to see, and it also reminds us to go outside more often to visit these special places.

Spending time outside has sparked new interests for inquiry within the classroom. We are looking deeper into worms and spiders as the students have several questions about these creatures in our own environment. We have begun to document our learning. Please come take a look and remember to come back often to see our progress.

When asked "how do you feel learning outside?" The responses were "very happy", "I love it", "tired" and "great!" They said they want to spend more time outside for their learning periods and we will ensure this happens.
