In the Bayview Secondary School IB Diploma Program, six courses are offered over two years in English, French, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and the Arts.


Two Diplomas

IB courses are offered in the final two years of high school. Students will take Bayview's specialized preparatory courses in English, French, Math, Science and History during their grade 9 and 10 years in order to prepare them for the IB Diploma Program.

To earn an IB diploma you

must successfully complete six courses with examinations set by the International Baccalaureate Organization, the Theory of Knowledge course, complete creativity, action, and service hours and write an independent 4,000 word research essay on a topic of your choice.

All IB external examinations and diplomas are prepared and awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organization. Universities may grant advanced standing in certain subject areas to IB graduates.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

IB teaches you how to learn, analyze, think critically, detect bias and present rational arguments.

Creativity, Action, Service (CAS)

IB students complete Creativity, Action, and Service hours as counter-balance to academic studies.

Extended Essay (EE)

Diploma candidates must write and submit for external marking a 4,000 word university-style research essay on a subject of their choosing.
