Re: Understanding the Elementary Provincial Report Card (Grades 1-8)

During the **week of February 12th**, you will receive your child's Term 1 Report Card. The report card describes how well your child has achieved the overall curriculum expectations for each subject and how well your child has demonstrated the development of learning skills and work habits essential to succeed in school and daily life. This report card represents evidence of student learning that has been gathered **from September to the end of January**.

Your child's teachers have written clear, personalized comments to provide meaningful feedback about your child as a learner. Teachers use their professional judgement to decide which aspects of learning, strengths, and next steps are most important to highlight for your child in a particular subject. Specific suggestions for how you can support your child's learning at home may also be provided.

For some subjects, the N/A box will be checked to indicate "no instruction for subject/strand for this reporting period." This means your child's achievement in some subject areas (e.g., Mathematics, The Arts) may appear blank for this reporting period. A letter grade or percentage mark for these areas will be provided on the June report card.

Although the homeroom teacher's name appears on the report card, subject-specific teachers have not been identified. Please refer to the November Elementary Progress Report Card or ask your child for this information.

We encourage you to review and discuss the report card with your child and take the opportunity to celebrate your child's accomplishments. Space is provided at the bottom of pages three and four to identify steps for improvement together with your child. Please complete and return the double-sided tear-off form to the homeroom teacher by February 20th, as it will be placed in your child's Ontario Student Record (OSR).

Should you have additional questions regarding the new report card, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

It's time to remind children about being safe online.

This is a good time for parents to learn about and review ways to keep their children safe online. Children today have access to the world at their fingertips. But with this access, there are risks. It's important for parents to talk to children about the importance of their personal information and stress that they should never disclose personal details that would allow someone online to contact them in real life.

Here are 10 tips provided by York Regional Police to promote safe online behaviour:

- Children should never give anyone their name, address, telephone number, computer password, or any other personal information on the Internet without parental or guardian consent
- Children should stay out of all chat rooms and websites that are not first approved by their parent or guardian
- The computer should be in a central place in your home where you can supervise their online activities
- Don't allow a webcam in a child's bedroom
- Reinforce that people online may not be who they say they are
- Consider using parental controls like Internet filters or blocking software
- Remind children that everything said online stays in cyberspace forever, whether or not it is deleted
- Talk to your children about Internet safety and clearly define your rules
- Remind children that photos sent over the internet or with cell phones are not private and can be easily shared with the general public

- **6.** I will work on being polite and not responding to my parent's requests with a smart tongue. I will remember my please, thank you, your welcome, and excuse me's. I will never say curse words. I will show respect for my elders with my words.
- **7. I will do my best in school.** I will hand in my homework on time and not wait until the night before my science fair project is due to start working on it. If I need extra help with a subject, I will ask for it.
- **8.** I will be kind to all kids. If I see someone who is sad, I will try to cheer him or her up. If a new kid comes to our school, I will show them around. I will not make fun of any kid, but rather say things that are great about that person.

Milne

In December our Grade 2, 4 and 7 students went to the Milne Outdoor Education Centre. It is ideally situated on the doorstep of the Milne Dam Conservation Park. Students explored a 120 hectare urban wilderness that contains a remarkable diversity of plants and animals. The Rouge River bisects the park from east to west and represents Milne's most significant natural feature. Milne's hands-on educational programs are connected to expectations of the Ontario Curriculum and provide students with the opportunity to learn in outdoor settings. A student from Mr. Thomas' class said "We learned about natural resources, how to survive in the woods, animals and natural disasters." Another student from Mme Salvagna's class said she "learned about the process of how different products are made" and that "Milne was very educational and the students had a lot of fun."

STS School Vehicle Cancellation Procedure

School bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements. Since some bussing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m. or earlier, all cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to ensure the safety of our students. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region. Decisions are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature and road conditions.

Please note the following: A decision to cancel school bus transportation may be **system wide** (where all buses in York Region are cancelled) **or municipality specific** (where buses in one or more municipalities are cancelled). If school bus transportation in your municipality is cancelled and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is operational, your child **will not** be transported to/from school. If school bus transportation in your municipality is operational and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is cancelled, your child **will not** be transported to/from school. **If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.**

When buses have been cancelled and you drive your child in to the school, please remember to be prompt picking up your child by 2:40. (Typically on those days your travel time will be increased and the school will be closed at 3 p.m.). Please ensure that your child has a lunch as no pizza will be delivered on a Snow Day. Also there will be no Kids' Kitchen on those days either. Please make sure that your child is dressed appropriately to play outside in all that soft, fluffy snow! We want to be proactive and make sure your child is prepared to have a good day. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.



Tobogganing and sledding safety

Tobogganing and sledding are fun, popular winter activities; however, every year hundreds of children are injured on toboggans. Here are some tips to keep your children safe!

- Parents should always actively supervise children at the toboggan/sled hill
- Dress children in warm layers of brightly coloured, waterproof clothes and boots
- · Use a neck warmer instead of a scarf, and cover children's head, ears and hands
- Teach children to toboggan/sled down the middle of hill and use the sides to walk to the top
- To prevent head injuries, children should wear a hockey or ski helmet; they are designed to protect the head in all directions in icy conditions
- Toboggans/sleds should be sturdy, easy to control and in good condition
- Remind children to sit on a toboggan/sled, face forward and avoid lying on their stomach no sledding head first
- Choose a hill with a gentle slope and enough room to stop. The hill should be free of hazards (e.g., trees and rocks) and be well lit to see any potential dangers and to be seen by others
- No jumping in front of toboggans/sleds going downhill and make sure only the recommended number of children ride the toboggan/sled
