Hours of Instruction for French Immersion

YRDSB offers a French Immersion program that is highly sought after. As we continue to implement recommendations from our recent French as a Second Language (FSL) review, we are making a slight adjustment, based on our research that will provide better consistency within our schools while also better meeting student needs. Research shows the importance of time spent learning in French at the beginning of a program. In Grades 1 to 3, YRDSB students receive 100 per cent of their instruction in French. Beginning in Grade 4, English instruction is introduced for a number of subjects. Starting in the 2014-15 school year, weekly instructional time in Grades 4-8 will be shared equally between French and English language of instruction. Students will accumulate at least 5,000 hours of French language instruction by the end of Grade 8, which far exceeds the 3,800 hours mandated by the Ontario Ministry of Education. YRDSB remains deeply committed to providing high quality and sustainable French as a Second Language (FSL) instruction.

Music Monday is an annual event in May where students, musicians, parents and community members celebrate the gift of music by singing and performing one piece of music simultaneously across Canada. Education Week

We had a wonderfully exciting education week! We welcomed our new junior Kindergarten students and their parents to school, thrilled our community with exhilarating music from our students and opened our classrooms to everyone on Friday morning. On Thursday, May 8, our Milliken Mills Public School's Eine Kleine Nachtmusik (A Little Night's Music) was a great success! It was a night filled with music ranging from heavy metal rock music to classical favorites such as the famous Canon in D. Students from Grades 4 to 8 showcased their talents with small ensembles to large full-scale concert band performances. Our Little Night's Music ended in a chorus of united voices when all our students performed, Is Somebody Singing. It is an anthem specially written by Canadian Space Agency Astronaut, Colonel Chris Hatfield and multiple Juno award winner, Ed Robertson from the group, BNL in celebration of Music Monday.

EQAO Testing: May 26 to June 6

The Grade 3 and Grade 6 Assessments of Reading, Writing, and Mathematics are conducted annually in every publicly funded Ontario elementary school under the auspices of the province's Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO). The assessments are based on the Ontario Curriculum and measure how well students have met the provincial expectations in reading, writing, and mathematics. Students' work is marked according to four levels of achievement based on the expectations in the provincial curriculum. Level 3 represents the expected standard for Grades 3 and 6, and identifies a high level of achievement of the 7 expectations. Teams of specially trained classroom teachers and administrators mark the work the students produce during the assessments. Our teachers have been preparing students for these assessments all year, while remembering that student learning is accumulative from each grade.

Thank You, Volunteers!

Thank you to all our volunteers who provide their time, skills and expertise to our students and staff. We are fortunate to have many parents, guardians and community members who volunteer their time and talents in a variety of settings to support our school. We are grateful to the volunteers who help in many different ways. Some serve in School Council, some in the library, others in out of class activities such as Sub Lunches, Healthy Snack Days, supervising during field trips and driving their child and others to sporting events. In every case, volunteers make a huge difference to our school community, and we honored that contribution with a Volunteer Tea on May 27th.

School Climate Survey

Between May 20 and June 6, we invited parents/guardians to participate in a school climate survey. The surveys provided the Board and our school with valuable information about how you feel about the school environment and your child's education. The results will be used to identify areas that need to be addressed, monitor progress and plan strategies to support student achievement and well being. We value parent input and encourage you to complete the survey. The information parents provide will be anonymous, considered confidential and kept in strict accordance with all relevant legislation.

Summer Institute

The York Region District School Board's Summer Institute is a program that offers academic, recreational and athletic programs and activities with intentional links to the Ontario Curriculum for children and youth from Kindergarten to Grade 8. Weekly sessions are offered at 12 elementary schools throughout the region from June 30, 2014 to August 8, 2014. Program hours are 9:00 am to 3:30 pm. Before and after care is provided at each location by YMCA, (additional cost) Summer Institute registration fees are \$115 per week for YRDSB students.



At Milliken Mills P.S. this summer, there will be a NEW Summer Institute program option offered, **International Language & Summer Institute (Mandarin-Simplified).** The students will be learning Simplified Mandarin for half a day, and participating in athletics, arts and recreational activities for the other half. Because the language program is funded by the Ministry, students only have to pay for the activities sessions. The total cost for the 6 week full-time program is \$320.
