We strive to ensure the safety of your children. We would like to remind you of some of the procedures which are in place:

- In order to ensure the visibility and accessibility of staff members on yard duty, all adults on outdoor duty wear reflective vests.
- Although we enjoy having visitors to the school, due to COVID restrictions we must

- limit our contact to virtual meetings and phone calls.
- Our doors are locked after the general entry in the morning and remain locked until the end of the school. There is a door buzzer for those who need access while the doors are locked. If you are picking up your child, please identify yourself using the buzzer and we will bring your child to the door.
- We have security cameras located around and throughout the school.

During the school year, we have regular Fire, Lock Down and Hold and Secure Drills.

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#### Personal Devices and Social Media at School

At Moraine Hills P. S., we recognize that many of our older students have phones and other personal devices that they bring to school on a regular bases. It is important that all students understand that these devices are not to be used to take photos or to record other students, staff or activities. They are not to be used in class unless they are directed to do so by an adult in charge. Students' personal devices should not be used on the school yard. Students who use their devices inappropriately will be asked to

keep them locked in their lockers. The school is not responsible for lost/stolen/damaged devices.

We also recognize that many of our older student have social media accounts (e.g., Instagram, TikTok).

Social media has many benefits including helping us to stay connected. Unfortunately, it also can be used in ways that spread hurt, misinformation, and dangerous and very disrespectful trends.

While we have engaged in lessons at school about online safety, we suggest that families support this learning and have ongoing discussions about social media presence and how to act online. To help support these discussions we encourage families to look at Media Smarts Social Media Tip Sheet and Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada 12 Quick Privacy Tips for Parents.

### Hallowe'en and the Safe and Supportive Schools Policy

Please be reminded that the York Region District School Board's Safe and Supportive Schools Policy strictly prohibits weapons and replica weapons on school property. A distinction is not made according to how realistic the replica appears to be. All real and toy guns, knives etc. fall into the same category and possession on school property will lead to a sus-

pension which could be up to twenty days. The policy applies to all students, regardless of age. Please discuss this with your children and ensure that all such toys are left at home.

Laser pointers are considered potentially dangerous and therefore fall into the same category.

This reminder is especially important to note as Hallowe'en

approaches. As your children choose their costumes, please keep in mind that they are not allowed to bring any replica weapons as props for their costumes.

## **Walking or Cycling to School**

- Contribution to the daily goal of 60 minutes of moderate or vigorous activity for children, improving their health and overall fitness.
- Reduced traffic congestion and improved safety for everyone in school zones.
- The promotion of a life-long habit that fosters independence and active lifestyles, preparing children for their future.

For those who can't walk or cycle to school every day, choosing active travel once, twice or a few days a week can still provide benefits. You can also consider parking a block away from the school and walking the rest of the way.

# PARKING LOT SAFETY

Please note, the school parking lot is closed to traffic other than school transit vehicles during peak pedestrian times: 8:10—8:30 a.m. and 2:45—3:05 p.m.

If you are in the parking lot when the buses arrive, you must wait until they exit the loop. Vehicles may not pass the busses in the bus loop.

If you are dropping off or picking up your child, please do so at a nearby location in the neighbour-hood and walk them the rest of the way if necessary. Parking is allowed on some streets, please check the signs carefully.

Please drive carefully in the school zone. It is imperative that you come to a full stop at the stop sign in front of the school. Please remember that making a U turn on the street in front of the school is very dangerous and that it is illegal to do so.

York Regional Police are concerned with the safety of school zones and will be increasing their presence during peak hours, issuing tickets to those who are not adhering to the law.

We welcome everyone to the 2021-2022 Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) program year and thank you for your continued support and patience.

Due to the continuance of the pandemic, ILIL classes for SK to Grade 8 students will take place online, not in the school buildings. Please note that the program delivery model may change from online to face-to-face during the school year depending on circumstances. Teachers will teach live language lessons in real time using Google Classroom to provide both synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities during the regularly scheduled language classes.
