- Rented clarinets

- They were raising around \$40 000/year. It came to their knowledge that there are elite athletes in East Gwillimbury. So they would support those kind of athletes.

- Community Fund: Spring Fair at the school they could possibly support the funding for the advertising. They support the Lions Club to help better the community.
- The applications are online. This is not operated by the town. It is run by an independent board that handles the golf tournament itself. Virginia Hackson does not adjudicate the applications, nor do any of the councillors. The boards consists of: 2 people from Mount Albert, 2 from Holland Landing, 1 from Sharon, and 2 from Queensville. These people make the decisions where the funds will go. This is very confidential.
- They are now up to around \$60 000/year.
- Back in June, schools in EG were allowed to apply for money in the following areas: sports, the arts, electronics, and the environment. All schools who applied received \$5000.00
- In total they have given out over just \$500 000 to the community.
