As many of you know, January 27th was International Family Literacy Day and we would like to share with you some of the suggestions that you can use going forward into February.

International Literacy Helpful Hints

Talk with your child:

Having conversations with your child helps him or her to

- ✓ Learn new words and phrases
- ✓ Explore how language works
- ✓ Express feelings, opinions, and reactions
- ✓ Ask questions to clarify his or her thoughts and feelings

Listening to your child helps him or her to

- ✓ Understand that his or her opinion is valued
- ✓ Learn to listen to others



Read with your child:

Reading together every day is really important, and can take place anywhere and anytime. You can try reading some of the following with your child:

- ✓ Picture books and alphabet books
- ✓ Food labels and recipes
- ✓ Traffic and construction signs
- ✓ Newspapers and magazines
- ✓ Television guides and flyers
- ✓ Card, letters, e-mails, and Web pages

Share with your child:

Participate in a variety of experiences with your child, including

- \checkmark Going to a library event such as story hour
- \checkmark Watching a television show and discussing things such as what might happen next or what the characters were like
- ✓ Going to a social, cultural or recreational activity in your neighbourhood







Math Tips

Illuminations is a project designed by the NCTM (National Council of Teachers of Mathematics) that offers free online games that align with curriculum expectations. Food Alert Regarding Allergies

"WOW BUTTER" IS NOT RECOMMENDED AT SCHOOL

Regional Health Departments state that schools must exercise due caution and refrain from allowing soy bean butter and other similar peanut-free spreads, like "WOW" soy butter, into schools. The risk is that these types of products look, smell and taste like peanut butter. It is difficult, if not impossible, to distinguish these products from real peanut butter. As a result, it makes it very challenging for school personnel to maintain a safe environment for all students. As alternatives, other peanut-free spreads that don't look, smell and taste like peanut butter can be used as part of a nutritious lunch. (eg. hummus, low fat ricotta cheese, vegetable purees, bean dips, or guacamole). We thank the Mount Joy families for helping us keep our students safe.


