

PULLEYS AND GEARS

On June 2nd, Scientist Chung came to our portable! She taught us about gears and pulleys. First we talked about Isaac Newton. Isaac Newton discovered gravity! We also talked about mechanical advantages for pulleys. Mechanical advantage is the advantage to lift the weight, which makes it easier. We talked about the No pulley system, the fixed pulley, moveable pulley, block and tackle, and double block and tackle. The moveable pulley, block and tackle, and double block and tackle gave a mechanical advantage. The fixed pulley didn't. We tested each one, and we found out that the double block and tackle gave the most mechanical advantage. Pulleys were really interesting!

We also learned about gears. You have probably heard of gears before. The most popular gear is the spur gear. It's the one where the gears are side by side. What about the other gears? There are 3 more gears that we talked about: The bevel gear, the worm gear, and the rack and pinion. The Bevel gears are gears that are at an angle. They are usually found in can openers. The worm gear is a gear that is turned and turns the worm gear above it. They are usually found in Music boxes. The rack and pinion is a gear that runs back and forth on another gear. They can be found in ice cream scoops. We sure learned a lot about pulleys and gears!
