Summer Reading Tips



Your school-aged child's summer reading and book discussions will help him maintain his reading skills, improve his reading fluency, and learn new vocabulary and concepts. Most importantly, when parents and children enjoy summer reading together, children develop a love of books and reading that lasts a lifetime.

Try some of these suggestions for making your school-aged child's summer full of literacy fun.

•Set aside a consistent time each day for reading.

•Read aloud to your reader.

•Connect read-aloud choices to summer activities. When you read and discuss books about things your child has experienced, you help her/him learn important vocabulary and extend her/his understanding of experiences.

•Allow your child to choose books for summer reading.

•Help your child select books at a comfortable level: if she/he makes five or more errors in reading a page of about 50 words, the book is too challenging.

•Encourage your child not to limit summer reading to books. Encourage your child to read the sports page to check up on her/his favorite baseball team or to read children's magazines.

•Read a book and watch the video together.

•Take books along on outings. Pack books in your beach bag or picnic basket. You and your child can enjoy books together anywhere you go this summer.

•Encourage your child to write this summer, too. From writing postcards to friends and relatives to keeping a journal while on a trip, summer presents unique ways for your child to write about her/his own experiences.

Dress Code

At school we strive to create an effective and safe learning environment that supports mutual respect, social and emotional growth. It is important that students dress appropriately for the task of learning. Clothing which demonstrates respect for self and others is expected at all times. During the warm weather, students are expected to wear something comfortable but appropriate for a school setting. Crop tops, spaghetti straps, short shorts, tube tops. Spandex, muscle shirts or any clothing that is transparent or contains offensive words or messages is not suitable for school wear. 
