K-Cup pods and other single-use coffee pods are recyclable and can be recycled with your containers in your blue box or container recycling bin, once the top and coffee grounds have been removed. **Used coffee grounds** are neutral so you can use them in your garden or potted plants at home.

How to Recycle Your Single-use Coffee Pods

- 1. Before throwing in the recycling, remove the plastic foil or top.
- 2. Remove any coffee grounds that are still in the pod with a rinse.
- 3. Place the empty coffee **pod container into your recycling bin.**
