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	<ul> <li>Playscape Games Painting Refresh/Tarmac Painting (i.e. new lines for basketball nets and or 4 corners): <ul> <li>Current paintings are out-of-date and fading</li> <li>No new tarmac is planned in the foreseeable future</li> <li>These are important for: <ul> <li>kids to engage in save play</li> <li>have another avenue for physical play that is constructive</li> <li>provide alternatives when the board closes the field to give the grass time to grow or when the field is icy and too slippery in winter</li> <li>during tarmac only recesses, ball play is restricted as the tarmac is too congested, and kids are bored</li> <li>promotes conflict management as well</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>	Council Votes to Support schools initiative to begin exploring options and costs.
	If the council approves, the school will begin the process of need to vetting through 3 different vendors, engaging with students, and potentially creating a small subcommittee of students who will meet with principals and vendors. This will be a great opportunity for students to see a practical project, with a theoretical component and roll it out.
